




# Luther's Letter

# More than Keeping the Doors Open

Many years ago I lived in rural Indiana. It was so nice to have a pharmacy and general store in the closest town, population about 1200. Our family shopped there and enjoyed visiting with people from the community who we would see while there. One day I was getting a prescription filled. I told the pharmacist, who also owned the store, that I was so glad the store was in town and what I liked about it. He thanked me for my comments and for shopping there. Then he told me that they were closing at the end of the month. There was no longer enough business to support the store, so they were closing to avoid bankruptcy. Locals were no longer shopping there, no matter how glad they were that there was a pharmacy in town.

Our congregation is, in many ways, doing fine. People are worshiping the Lord as a community of faith. We are able to pay our bills. Ministry is happening by and among the people. We are glad that we are "keeping the doors open".

We are not called to keep institutions going, but institutions such as our congregation help us fulfill our calling as the church. The institution of the Church, in any community, is meant to be an instrument of God's faithful work in and through the people. We have the opportunity to build a more faithful future together. There are some notable ways you can be part of how we move beyond "keeping the doors open" and into living out God's mission for this congregation. These are things which will also help us work together to "keep the doors open" and will do even more.

# PASTOR'S ARTICLE continued-

Here are some things which you may already be doing. You may also resume doing, if you have reduced or stopped doing these things. You may also start doing some of these for the first time. Each will serve multiple, positive ends. One is that you will help the congregation to do our ministry together.


Another is that you will be investing in your faith life and growing both closer to Jesus Christ and becoming more like him. As you grow closer to Jesus, and become more like Jesus, you will be more able to serve the Lord, love your neighbor, and be a blessing as you have been blessed by God.

So, here are some ways you can help your church, and be a more faithful Christ-Follower at the same time.



- 1) Seek to receive Holy Communion on a regular and frequent basis. As we receive Jesus in this Sacrament we are being more and more connected with him. The most normal time and place to receive this Sacrament is at our regular weekend worship services. As we work together as the two congregations (Martin Luther Lutheran in Carmine and Waldeck Lutheran) we also offer worship more than once per weekend. Sundays: 8:00 a.m. in Waldeck; 10:00 a.m. in Carmine; also on the 2nd and 4th Saturdays in Carmine at 6:00 p.m. On nearly every weekend there are people from one congregation present at the other. Many find one time or another to be more workable for their schedule that weekend. If none of the scheduled times work for you. then let's talk about what could be for you and others to receive Holy Communion more frequently.
- 2) Seek Reconciliation with your brothers and sisters in Christ. Disconnection, disagreement and conflict happen in the best of churches, and we have a wonderful congregation.

To reconcile with others, start by making the choice to view the other person as someone for whom Jesus Christ has died. That other person is loved by God, just as you are. People often dehumanize others, and things get worse from there.



Remember, we are in this life together, and we are better off working out whatever it is that divides us. I invite you to prayerfully seek to see the face of Christ in each other. Approach life with an openness to a better life together. Remember that each of us is usually a contributor to the item of conflict. If you see a fellow Christian as an enemy, then do what Jesus says, "Love your enemies." Let's get together about what is hurting so that we can work through the pain, and then grow to be reconciled.

- 3) Pray for congregational leaders including the church council and pastor. Pray that they will know Christ more fully. Pray that they will seek to follow the calling of Jesus for his Church. Pray that they will be faithful and bold in serving and leading.
- 4) Seek the Holy Spirit's guidance to note at least one thing each day for which you are thankful. Work to include items connected to our life as a congregation. Include these in your daily prayer life.
- 5) Create openings for people to serve God, Church and neighbor in our congregation's ministries. This could be something as simple as involving another person in some task.
- 6) Reject any participation in gossip. Don't share it, listen to it, create it, tolerate it.
- 7) Give generously to God through the ministries of the church. Keep up your offerings even when you can't be at worship each week.
- 8) Pray for an openness to new people in the congregation. Pray for an openness to fresh ways of doing

ministry. New people need a local church. Fresh ideas often can help us be even more faithful to the calling of God in our lives.

9) Let the Word of Christ dwell in you richly. In other words, read, study, listen to, meditate on, and live out God's Word in your life. Seek the Holy Spirit's guidance in understanding the Word. Seek the Holy Spirit's stirring for you to know and follow Jesus more faithfully. Take time each day to dwell in God's Word.



10) Have some grace for one another as we live out our journey together. In our sin we often do things to harm one another. Sometimes we do it with real intent. Sometimes we react to situations with anger, and don't really get how it affects others. Sometimes we are not even conscious of our attitudes and actions which harm others. Sometimes we choose to dismiss or harm one person, and end up causing more damage to others. Let's work to show God's grace to others as we have been shown this by God.

These are not the end all of ministry as God's people, but these are some notable ways that we can move beyond just "keeping the doors open". In response to all that God has already done for us and provided for us, as we seek to know Jesus in this life we will get to do more for Christ and his Church than we ever thought we could.




