
- 1. The youths are giving of their time and energy to serve others who are in need.

REPORT ON SPECIAL CONGREGATIONAL MEETING:

Sunday, March 13, 2016 Subject. Funding to Complete Parsonage Renovations

At the meeting, the congregation approved the additional expenses for the parsonage renovations. This amounts to about \$10,000. By the time of the meeting, \$7,000 had been donated by members and friends of the congregation to help pay this amount. As needed, an amount up to \$3,000 was approved to be taken from memorial funds. The amount taken from memorials could be reduced by donations.

Members and friends of the congregation are invited to make donations toward this approved amount. Thank you to the church council and the congregation for addressing this issue in a positive manner so we can complete this project.

Parsonage renovations are continuing at this time. A rededication date has not yet been set.

Council members discussed the possibility of getting rid of unnecessary items in the closet. The items would be available first to any member who may want such item, and then either donated or disposed of. Dana said she would take this idea to the next Christian Educational Meeting.

Worship, Outreach, Property and Stewardship Committees had no reports for March.

New Business: Pastor Tinker asked the council members if they would be okay with having a speaker from Lutheran Foundation of Southwest come to one of the meetings to inform how families can set up a plan to give to their church. The council members agreed they would like for her to come.




