#### **PASTOR'S ARTICLE:**

Matthew 28:16-20 The Great Commission

God's Action and Our Calling – Part 4 of 6, Matthew 28:16-20 The Great Commission

One of the last things Jesus did in the time before his Ascension to the Father was to give instructions. One of the ways he did this is recorded in the book of Matthew, chapter 28. Jesus had gathered his 11 remaining Apostles for these final instructions.

Here is what we read at the very end of the book: "16 Now the eleven disciples went to Galilee, to the mountain to which Jesus had directed them. 17 When they saw him, they worshiped him; but some doubted. 18 And Jesus came and said to them, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. 19 Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, 20 and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age."

This is not some minor teaching of Jesus. The church has rightly called this "The Great Commission", for this is the major "marching orders" for the people of God. There are several notable elements in this.

Authority – Jesus stresses the importance of this by backing his statement with the full authority of God. He is stressing – "take me very seriously in this matter."

Go – He calls on us to "Go". His calling for us is not a passive waiting. We are instructed to "Go" into all the world. If we plan to sit back and wait for people to come to us we are doing just the opposite of what Jesus has called upon us to do. Jesus said, "Go," and that is central to all we do as the church.

Make Disciples – our job is to do things which help others learn to follow the way of Jesus. Our words, actions and ministries are to be very connected to helping others know Jesus and know how to follow him.

Baptize – The Sacrament of Holy Baptism is one of the most important connection points between God and humanity. Part of what happens in Baptism is that the Holy Spirit is brought into a person's life in a powerful way. Anytime the Holy Spirit enters our lives greater faith happens. We are called to Baptize, which includes sharing the good news with people of all ages, so that they can be united with the Christ Jesus and his saving work for us.

God's Name – We are called to address God in a personal way. Jesus directly teaches us to use the name, "Father, Son and Holy Spirit" to address him in prayer, to refer to him, and to use when baptizing a person. We are deliberate in our choice of words to address the Lord. God is in charge of himself, and it is most respectful to use the names revealed in scripture when talking about God or referring to God.

Teaching – the teaching ministry of the church is essential. We teach God's Word to adults, youth and children.

We also eagerly seek to participate in learning and individual study of God's Word.

God is always with us – the promise of Jesus is that he will always be with us. He transforms his way of being with us when he ascends to the Father, but he never leaves us. The presence of God is a great blessing. The Lord is committed to be with us through all of life's journey.

As we move forward in ministry at Martin Luther Lutheran Church it is important that we seek out God's instructions regarding what we are to do as his people. The Great Commission is a significant part of God's instructions for our life together. In September, Mark 12:28-32, Greatest Commandment

#### CHURCH COUNCIL SUMMARY



The Church Council of Martin Luther Lutheran Church of Carmine, Texas met for its monthly meeting in the church parlor on Monday July 20, 2015 at 6:15 p.m. The meeting was called to order by Council President Todd Dooley. Pastor David Tinker and nine Council members were present. Samantha ULlrich provided the devotion.

The minutes for the June 15, 2015 Council meeting were presented. A motion passed to accept the minutes. The Treasurer's Report was presented. Year-to-date expenses ending June 30, 2015 for MLLC (not including MLLS) were \$213,105.14 of which \$79,611 were for the parsonage renovations. Total income year-to-date was \$122,798.94. For the month of June 2015 MLLC expenses were \$43,853.34 and income was \$15,108.41. For the MLLS, total year-to-date expenses ending June, 30 2015 were \$89,808.86. Total year-to-date income for MLLS was \$86.514.78. For the month of June 2015, MLLS expenses were \$18,206.63 which included three pay periods and income was \$13,145.43. As of the end of June 2015 the General Fund checking account balance was negative \$7,871.66. A motion passed to accept the report as presented.

Pastor David Tinker made the following report. He thanked the Council and congregation for our support and prayers during his father's recent serious illness. He requested that the Council and the congregation think about what we enjoy about our life together at MLLC. He would like us to share 1-3 items of note and share with him. These items will help us reflect on the good things we have at MLLC and will be a part of our

looking to the future of the congregation in the coming years.

There was one death in the congregation recently. Sandy Pierce's memorial service will be held in Illinois in August while a service in Carmine will be held in October. The wedding of Sierra Kunkel & Alan Richard was July 11th. A new member reception was held on July 12th. Dates for photos for the upcoming photo directory will be September 15-19th. Pastor continues to lead the adult Sunday School class and Chapel with the MLLS students. He attended Confirmation camp week June 14-19<sup>th</sup> as well as several committee meetings in June. There is a youth camp week August 2nd -7th which includes 28 youth from MLLC and Bethlehem Lutheran in Round Top. Vacation Bible School was a big success with an increased attendance of over 50% from recent years. There were over 30 volunteers both teen and adult. Pastor will be on vacation the weekend of July 25th & 26th. Pastor Bill Derrick will be our preacher and presiding minister that weekend. Upcoming special dates: August 22 & 23rd – Lutherhill Director Matt Kindsvatter to preach at both service and will provide the Sunday School Lesson; August 30th - Rally Sunday and Water Fun Day; September 6th -Labor Day Sunday (Sunday School at 9am and Worship at 10:15am); October 4th - Synod staff visitor, Peggy Hahn, to preach at Sunday service; October 18th - Harvest Fest @ Carmine Hall; & November 8<sup>th</sup> -WELCA Thankoffering Service.

The MLLS Day School reported that enrollment numbers for June 2015 were 34 full-time students and five drop-in students. Jennifer Vaclavik and Kelli Meinholdt are doing the housekeeping and staff relief. Summer activities are in progress and vary from a water day, outdoor games, etc. There were three pay periods during the month of June. Fundraisers for the MLLS were discussed. Council recommended conducting an annual fundraising

meal that would be supported by the congregation and MLLS parents. Enrollment is down overall for the upcoming school year. The MLLS committee proposed an increase in student tuition. After discussion, a motion passed to accept the proposal for a \$20 per month increase in tuition per student. The MLLS committee recommended a slight pay raise for MLLS staff to include providing insurance for Director Kelli Meinholdt. After discussion, a motion passed to accept the proposal.

The Christian Education Committee reported that VBS was a huge success with 44 children participating. The Committee wants to thank everyone who helped out in any way with the success of VBS. Plans for next summer are already beginning.

The Worship Committee reported that the quote for the additional microphones and equipment has increased by \$200. The manufacturer raised the cost to the supplier. The increase in cost was presented to the Stewardship Committee to request Memorial Funds/Designated gifts to cover the difference which was later approved. The Prayer Chain list has been finalized and procedures are in the making. Labor Day Sunday potluck meal has been decided on with pulled pork as the main dish along with buns and condiments provided by Worship Committee. Congregation members are asked to bring sides and desserts. Door prizes will be awarded again this year. A second banner stand has been requested, researched and found for \$395. It is identical to the existing stand. It has been presented to the Stewardship Committee for purchase with Memorial Funds.

The <u>Outreach Committee</u> reported that they hosted the new member reception on July 12<sup>th</sup>.

The Committee will organize, serve, and host a breakfast for the RT-C and MLLS teachers and staff on August 20th at 8:30 a.m. in the fellowship hall. The congregation is asked to help by providing food and drinks as well as serving. The Committee will help as needed with the Labor Day meal on September 6th.

The Stewardship Committee reported that they tabled the request from the Worship Committee for an additional banner stand. The Harvest Festival is being discussed. The Committee is discussing having an auction this year and the pros and cons of previous years and possibly doing something different. After discussion among Council, a motion passed to give the Stewardship Committee the authority to decide how to handle the auction. The Committee requests help getting good quality items to help make this a success! The earlier the better!

The parsonage renovations are coming along fine. The sheetrock will soon be installed and paint colors will be decided soon. The new pictorial directory is in the near future. Help is still needed to assist in working on this project.

Property Committee presented to Council a proposal to install a fountain and benches in front of the church entrance. This item was tabled following discussion of more immediate needs of replacing two heating/air conditioning units in the sanctuary. It was decided to lay sod grass until a better time when a plan can be proposed and approved for this area.

Property Committee presented that one of the heating/air conditioning units in the sanctuary is in immediate need of replacement while the other is not in good shape. It was discussed that there have been problems with these units not cooling properly and that one, as of this past winter, does not provide any heat to the sanctuary. A motion passed to proceed with replacing the two units which will require approval by the congregation in a special called meeting. One bid has

been received and more will be solicited prior to a congregational meeting.

The next regular Council meeting was set for Monday August 17<sup>th</sup>, 2015 at 6:15PM. Amber Dooley volunteered to provide the devotion. A motion passed to adjourn and the meeting was adjourned with the Lord's Prayer.
