Dear MLLC Member:

A special congregational meeting is being called for Sunday, August 14th, 2016 in regards to the Martin Luther Lutheran School. As many of you know Kelli Meinholdt, Director of MLLS, will be resigning her position effective July 29, 2016. The Day School board is currently seeking qualified applicants for the position. This position has been posted in the local newspapers, church website, and other social media. There are several criteria that must be met in order to be a qualified Day School Director.

At this time, we have no applicants who meet all criteria. In order to continue the Day School at this time the School Board and Church Council have put a tentative plan in place. This plan includes the following:

- Beginning July 20, 2016 Nikki Pohl, a current MLLS teacher, who has completed the Certification Process with the exception of Business Hours needed and is working on completing the necessary work experience hours will begin shadowing the current Director, Kelli Meinholt for her remaining time at MLLS.
- The state allows a 1 month period in which a non-certified Director can serve without the need of turning in a waiver.
- The MLLS Board has filed a waiver to the state to allow Nikki Pohl, a non-certified person, to serve as a Director beyond the 1-month allotted time period.
- Nikki Pohl will assume the role of Interim-Director beginning Monday, August 1, 2016.

At the meeting financial information will be shared, we will discuss new developments, and our options moving forward. MLLS Board and MLLC council members are working to gather information daily. It is our hope to find a solution to this matter in order to keep the Day School in operation.

Labor Day Weekend WorshipBy Pastor David Tinker

Sunday, September 4 (Labor Day Weekend) will be the first day of our new schedule for Shared Ministry with Waldeck Lutheran Church. Including September 4, worship at Waldeck will be at 8:00 a.m. each week, and worship at MLLC will be at 9:45 each week. We will continue our 2nd and 4th Saturday services each month at 6:00 p.m. at MLLC.

The beginning of September brings a Holy Day of sorts for all of us. Labor Day is a civic holiday to celebrate the opportunity for work. As Lutheran Christians we go deeper with this and view all work as part of God's calling and his provision of our daily bread. All Christians are doing the work of God, regardless of where or what they do in their honorable vocation in life.

A few years ago I

student, etc.

discovered a concise statement written by a fellow Lutheran pastor regarding the Lutheran Christian understanding of vocation. Here is an excerpt of what Pastor Samuel Schuldheisz, Redeemer Lutheran Church (LC-MS) of Huntington Beach, CA, writes, "... our earthly vocations or "stations in life" as Luther called them are fruits of our heavenly calling as God's children in baptism. The purpose of vocation is to love and serve the neighbor in the particular stations in life that God has called us to whether we are a husband, wife, father, mother, son, daughter, teacher,

We don't live life hidden in a corner. This was the danger of many priests and monks in the Reformation era. Many taught that the highest form of Christian living was to become a monk and live in a monastery.

Luther wrote extensively against this false teaching as he rediscovered the doctrine of vocation and began to teach and preach about its necessity in the Christian life. Luther taught that on one level, there is no difference between monk and magistrate or priest and plumber. Each Christian is called according to God's Word and Spirit, regardless of what their status in society is. This means that God's calling of a Roadkill Collector is just as holy as God's calling to be a pastor.

The difference is the office and duties that are unique to each vocation. For example, the pastoral office is not the office of school teacher, just as the office of

father is not the same as the office of mother. Each vocation, or calling from God, has particular and unique duties attached to it. This is how God works in, with, and under the ordinary means of this life to accomplish His good and gracious will, physically and spiritually."

To celebrate this blessing of vocation we will be taking the Sunday of Labor Day weekend to give thanks for the blessings of daily bread, of work, of school, of family, etc. To enhance our time together you are invited to wear the clothes or uniform of your current or pre-retirement vocation. No matter what, know that we will be giving thanks for and honoring all that God has called each of us to do as part of his greater work in the world. Know that who each of us is and what God has called and equipped each of us to do is important. On Sunday, September 4, we will take time to give thanks for all which God calls and equips us to do. As part of this we will have a pot-luck lunch following worship. More details about the meal will be in upcoming announcements. We look forward to seeing you September 4 and on other Sundays in the weeks to come.

COUNCIL MEETING SUMMARY- July 18

The Church Council of Martin Luther Lutheran Church, Carmine, met on Monday, July 18, 2016. The meeting was called to order at 6:15 p.m. by President Shayne Kirts.

The devotion was given by Pastor Tinker on the topic of Change. He shared the Bible passage from the Sermon on the Mount.

Ann O'Hara, Kristi Wunderlich, and Ed Eargle, members of the Martin Luther Lutheran School Board were present at the meeting. They, along with council member, Blake Dooley, informed the Council that MLLS Director, Kelli Meinholdt's last day would be July 29, 2016. Applications were reviewed. (See letter on page 2 of this newsletter about a special called meeting.)



The Council meeting was then suspended for approximately one hour, while the Council met with Waldeck's Church Council and Pastor Blair Lundborg from the Synod office to discuss the shared ministry. It was decided to have MLLC worship at 9:45 a.m. and Sunday School at 9:00. Waldeck will have worship at 8:00 a.m. This time schedule will be for a six-month trial period.


