* ADVENT IS A BEGINNING!

Many Christians may not realize that Advent is the beginning of the church year. The church year starts with our preparation to celebrate the birth of Christ and anticipate His second coming.

After <u>Christmas</u>, churches move on to observe Epiphany (the arrival of the wise men). <u>Epiphany</u> is always observed on January 6.

Next comes the beginning of <u>Lent</u> on Ash Wednesday. Lent continues through <u>Holy Week</u> when we observe Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter.

Forty days after Easter we recall the ascension of Christ (Acts 1.9) on Ascension Day.

Fifty days after Easter comes the birthday of the church when the Holy Spirit descended upon Christ's followers in Jerusalem giving them power and unity. It happened on the day of Pentecost, a harvest holiday first celebrated by Jews. Pentecost is observed until the start of Advent, when the church year begins again.

* ADVENT VESPER SERVICES AND MEALS.

This Sunday, November 29th, is the First Sunday of Advent. Vespers services start on Wednesday, December 2, with a meal in the fellowship hall starting at 6.00 p.m., and the worship service at 7.00 p.m. (Both meal and worship service will be in the fellowship hall). Worship Committee serves the first meal, and LYO and Christian Ed on December 9. Care Committee will serve on December 16. (See Pastor's Article on page 2 for more on the Advent Series).



In addition, the Sunday Schoolage students will participate in a special Christmas craft on Sunday, December 20, and a craft reflecting the story of the wisemen on the 27th. The regular Sunday School schedule starts again on January 3rd.

ADVENT SERIES: THE WORD BECAME FLESH – John 1:1-18 By Pastor David Tinker

You are invited to participate in our special Advent services on Wednesdays this December. This Advent we will look more deeply into the message of the Prologue of John's Gospel. This passage is used as the Gospel Reading at our annual Christmas Day worship service (December 25 at 10:00 a.m.). We will hear more about how the Word of God became flesh and lived among us. As Advent is always a part of our preparation for Christmas, our hope is that you will gain greater appreciation of this passage through your participation in these services. Here is how these Wednesdays will flow.

Wednesday, December 2 Word and Light

We will see how the same Word of God which created light and life and the universe, is the same Word which comes into the world.

Wednesday, December 9 People and Tabernacle We will see how God enters our human reality as he takes up residence among his beloved, yet sinful, people.

Wednesday, December 16 Torah and Grace

We will see how the Covenant at Mt. Sinai, with the ten Commandments, were a good thing for the people, and how the more wonderful Word made flesh brings us God's most excellent grace.

Another interesting and different part of this will be how our worship space will be set up. We will set up part of the Fellowship Hall to be a giant Advent Wreath. We will have church-in-the-round, and will have four large candles in the space, reminding us of the four Sundays of Advent, and the Light of Jesus Christ coming into the world.

We look forward to seeing you at these wonderful times of fellowship, prayer and spiritual growth.

In our Lent Series in February and March 2016 we will again welcome area Lutheran Pastors to share the message during the five Wednesdays after Ash Wednesday and before Palm Sunday. More information will be shared in the January and February newsletters.

2015 HARVEST FESTIVAL WRAP-UP

First and foremost, we offer our thanks to the dozens of people who gave their time and resources to make this annual event a great success. We are thankful for volunteers, bakers, coordinators, cooks, raffle donators, raffle ticket buyers, auction donators, auction bidders, auction staff, music leaders, game and craft leaders, and everybody who did so much.

Here are some highlights of the day: We began the day with worship outside with the cooks. About 36 people gathered for prayer and communion before the main cooking took place. The work of cooking would be taking place during the main 9:30 a.m. worship service, so we gathered early to praise the Lord and to give him thanks.

Worship in the Hall at 9:30 a.m. – close to two hundred gathered in

the main hall for God's Word and Holy Communion. We enjoyed worship songs led by our Praise Team. We chose to use Country & Western based worship songs for this service.

Homecoming – We had a few dozen folks attend as members of Confirmation Classes celebrating anniversaries. This year we had classes with years ending in 5 or 0.

Fun and Games – we enjoyed a variety of fun, games and crafts for kids. The fish pond, which was revived after being gone a few years, was especially popular.

Meal – Carmine has the best fried chicken, and we enjoyed this great fried chicken meal together.

Several hundred meals were prepared and sold on this special day.

Raffle & Silent Auction – Dozens of donated items were raffled off or sold at the silent auction. The raffle was a new addition, and it turned out to be quite popular. The raffle and silent auction are always fun and these help support the ministry of the congregation as we reach out to others.

Clean Up – a faithful crew of dozens stayed after to clean up and reset the hall after the festival. This crew is a great blessing as we serve our community by making the hall ready for the next users.

KEEPING "CHRIST" AND "MAS" IN CHRISTMAS By Pastor David Tinker

Every year I hear people mention something along these lines: "We need to keep Christ in Christmas". I am 100% for keeping Christ is Christmas. Christmas, for Christians, is about Jesus Christ. It is about the birth of the Messiah, known to us as the Christ. For Christians, the connection between Jesus and the Christmas celebration is central.

Many others in our culture have no connection with Jesus. Christmas, for these folks, is not about the birth of Jesus, regardless of the name of the day. For many, it is about warm feelings, gifts, decorations, and the like. Some don't know the connection to the savior of the world.

Others do know the connection, but choose to put that aside. It is not our job to force people who don't care about Jesus to "keep Christ in Christmas". Rather, it is our job to regularly revisit the truth of the Good News that God has come among us in the baby Jesus to bring life, light, hope and forgiveness to the human race.

We then follow the way of Jesus as we announce the good news and bring God's goodness into the lives of others.

One of the essential ways to keep Christ in Christmas is this: We need to keep both "Christ" and "Mas" in Christmas. The term "Christmas" is a combination of two ideas which, together, designate one thing. Let's look at these words.

- 1 Christ. This is the title for the role which Jesus has. He is the "Anointed one" of Israel. He is the Messiah, the special and ultimate king set apart by God the Father to fulfill his greater purposes for the world. Anointed One = Ultimate King in the family line of David = Messiah = Christ.
- 2 Mas. This is a shortened form of the word "mass". This is connected with the dismissal of God's people from the gathering for Holy Communion. Through time the word 'missa' became 'mass'. Luther and the reformers used the term "mass" to refer to worship with Holy Communion.

The Holy Communion mass remembering the Nativity or Birth of Jesus the Christ is on December 25 each year. It is the "Christmass" when we celebrate the Christ. These words are pushed together, and we have "Christmas".

So, this Christmas, reflect on God's grace. Then do your best to keep both the "Christ" and the "Mas" in Christmas. Celebrate
Jesus in your personal celebrations. Gather with his people for Holy Communion and worship on Christmas Day. Then go out, show love for your neighbor, and show love for one another. While doing this, share the greatest news of all: that Jesus Christ is born for us.

Both "Christ" and "mass" are important. I invite you to attend the "Christ-Mass" on Friday, December 25th, at 10 a.m. at MLLC.

CHURCH COUNCIL SUMMARIES: (two meetings)



The Church Council of Martin Luther Lutheran Church of Carmine, Texas met for its monthly meeting in the church parlor on Monday October 19, 2015, at 6:15 p.m. The meeting was called to order by Council President Todd Dooley. Pastor David Tinker and eight Council members were present with one member absent. Pastor Tinker provided the devotion.

The minutes for the September 21, 2015, Council meeting were presented. A motion was made and passed to accept the minutes. The Treasurer's Report was presented. Year-to-date expenses ending September 30, 2015, for MLLC (not including MLLS) were \$322,764.65 of which \$131,328.09 were for the parsonage renovations. Total income year-to-date was \$182,311.16. For the month of September 2015 MLLC expenses were \$36,248.19 and income was \$15,899.98. For the MLLS, total year-to-date expenses ending September 30, 2015, were \$133,706.81. Total year-to-date income for MLLS was \$125,840.47. For the month of September, 2015, MLLS expenses were \$15,263.28 and income was \$12,229.35. As of the end of September 2015 the General Fund checking account balance was \$15,389.04. A motion passed to accept the report as presented.

Pastor Tinker made the following report. We have received the baptism and confirmation records for new members, Brick and Debbie Peele. A new member reception will be held in the next couple of months. Sheldon Mitchel from Philips and Luckey Funeral Home would make a presentation

regarding wills on October 25th. A future wedding scheduled for Shelby Markwardt and Robert Vaughn on July 30, 2016. Memorial service for Sandy Pierce would be on Saturday, October 24th, at 11:30am. Pastor continues to lead the adult and teen Sunday School classes and Chapel with the MLLS students. He attended several committee meetings in September and he continues to work on the web page. Pastor Tinker will attend a "Boundaries Workshop" at Salem in Brenham. This is a required event for all pastors and other ELCArostered leaders. Upcoming special dates: October 24-25th - Reformation Sunday; November 1st- All Saints Sunday; November 8th - WELCA Thankoffering Service with meal; November 22nd - Synod Staff Visitor, Peggy Hahn; November 29th - Advent begins; December 2, 9, & 16th -Advent Wednesday services (meal at 6pm & Worship at 7pm); & December 13th – Children's Christmas Program and brunch.

The MLLS Day School reported enrollment numbers for September, 2015 were 28 full-time students and 9 drop-in students. The curriculum for the school year September thru May was purchased this month at an expense of \$1,567.58. Tuition for September not collected during the month was \$1,465. Beginning in October they would be selling Yankee Candles as a fund raiser. Important dates: October 21st – visit the Carmine Fire Station; October 23rd – Trick-Or-Treating at Carmine State Bank.

The <u>Property Committee</u> reported that replacement of the heating and airconditioning units in the sanctuary would begin on October 20th. The new units are larger than the old units and the wall will have to be removed and re-framed. The Committee will continue to pursue having the parking lot completed in front of the Mission and Ministry building.

The Stewardship Committee reported that the Harvest Fest was a big success! The raffle tickets (not including the silent auction) generated

a little more revenue this year than the live auction did during the previous year. Final numbers are still being calculated, but profit generated from this year's event should exceed \$15,000. Many thanks to everyone who donated items for the raffle and silent auction and to all of those who donated their time and talents to help make this a successful and enjoyable event.

In other business, Pastor Tinker reported that the paperwork for changing the church's service plan for our long distance phone service has been submitted. This will save MLLC a significant amount of money each year. In previous years, MLLC has not had to pay for rental of the Carmine Hall for the Harvest Fest. After discussion was made concerning the use and rental of the Hall, Ronnie Siptak made a motion that we donate \$1,000 to the Carmine Hall for past use of the Hall. Dennis Smith seconded the motion and the motion passed. Discussion was also made that appropriate rental fees for the Hall be included in the upcoming MLLC budgeting process.

Council discussed upcoming vacancies and elections for outgoing Council member positions. The Nominating Committee will be seeking individuals to replace the following positions: Vice-President Elect, Council Secretary, and Stewardship Committee representative. Several committees throughout the congregation are also seeking officers and members. MLLC members are asked to seriously consider volunteering for these roles in the leadership of our congregation. Please contact the MLLC office if you are interested.

A "Thank You" note was read from the Synod office for our continued financial support that is contributed to the Synod annually.

The next regular Council meeting was set for Monday November 16, 2015, at 6:15PM. Todd Dooley volunteered to provide the devotion. A motion passed to adjourn and the meeting was adjourned with the Lord's Prayer.

The minutes for the October 19, 2015, Council meeting were presented. A motion passed to accept the minutes. The Treasurer's Report was presented. Year-to-date expenses ending October 31, 2015, for MLLC (not including MLLS) were \$366,490.40 of which \$148,488.61 were for the parsonage renovations. Total income year-todate was \$220,721.88. Overall for the year-to-date, excluding expenses for the parsonage and multi-purpose building, the Church has a net income of \$8,319.66. For the month of October, 2015, MLLC expenses were \$43,725.75 and income was \$38,410.72. For the MLLS, total year-to-date expenses ending October 31, 2015, were \$146,399.75. Total year-to-date income for MLLS was \$140,867.92. For the month of October, 2015, MLLS expenses were \$12,692.94 and income was \$15,027.45. A motion passed to accept the report as presented.

Pastor Tinker made the following report. Peggy Hahn from the Gulf Coast Synod office would be our guest preacher on November 22nd. She was interested in getting together with leaders after worship

that day. Future wedding scheduled for Shelby Markwardt and Robert Vaughn on July 30, 2016. Pastor continues to lead the adult and teen Sunday School classes and Chapel with the MLLS students. He attended several committee meetings in October and led early morning worship at the Carmine Hall prior to the Harvest Festival. Confirmation class continues with Bethlehem Lutheran in Round Top. MLLC has 2 students in the program this year. Pastor continues to work on the web page. The Synod office is conducting strategic planning. They will be sending an electronic survey to Council members to complete. Upcoming special dates: November 22nd - Synod Staff Visitor, Peggy Hahn; November 29th – Advent begins; December 2, 9, & 16th – Advent Wednesday services (meal at 6pm & Worship @7pm); & December 13th - Children's Christmas Program and brunch.



The MLLS Day School reported they will conduct a meal fundraiser in February. Date is tentatively set for February 7th. They are hoping to have tickets ready to sell by end of December. Meals will be "to go" only. Meal will consist of chickenfried steak, potatoes, green beans and gravy. A sign-up sheet will be placed in the narthex for congregation members to bake cookies. MLLS students will make Valentine's cards to place with each meal. The floors need to be professionally buffed in classrooms as they have not been done in at least five years. A proposal for Christmas bonuses for MLLS staff was discussed. After discussion, a motion passed to approve the bonuses. Council discussed MLLS Board members' terms that are expiring. The Board will look into this further.

The <u>Christian Education Committee</u> reported they will team with the LYO to provide a pancake dinner Advent

meal on December 9th. Christmas program practice began November 15th. The program will be held on December 13th; special Christmas craft on December 20th, and a craft dealing with the story of the wise men on the 27th.

The Worship Committee reported that they wish to thank everyone who helped with the Harvest Fest. The new microphones are in and have been installed. A sign-up sheet is in the narthex for those interested in participating in the carol service on December 20th.

The Prayer Chain is ready to be activated. Advent services and meals will be held in the Fellowship Hall in the Round on December 2. 9, & 16th. Worship Committee will serve on the 2nd, LYO/Christian Ed on the 9th. December 16th Advent meal still needs a volunteer/group to provide the meal. We are looking at beginning a Baptismal Anniversary Sunday. The second Sunday of each month we are looking at celebrating everyone's baptism for the month beginning in January. Complaints are coming from the congregation regarding the hymnal markers. Ushers are requested to check pews following church services. The With One Voice Hymnals (blue hymnals) are requested to be placed in the pews on their sides to save them. They are beginning to show wear and tear. The extra red hymnals have been placed at the end of the pews. Noisy offering recipient has been designated to be Missionary Support.

The Outreach Committee reported that a new member reception will be planned for January. Pastor Tinker will work with the Committee to set a date. The Stewardship Committee reported they discussed the outcome of the Harvest Fest. Pastor Tinker and Samantha Ullrich will work to send out "thank you" notes to all the donors and winners of the raffle and silent auction items. The Committee discussed the possibility of some of our members getting only one envelope a month for offering.


The members requesting only one envelope could let the church office know and they would create an envelope for them to be picked up. Their name would then be removed from the envelope mail-out list.

A "Thank You" note was read from Emma Baird for the prize she won for the pumpkin contest at the Harvest Fest. A "Thank You" note was read for MLLC's annual contribution to Mission Support.

The next regular Council meeting was set for Monday December 21, 2015 at 6:15PM. Todd Dooley will provide the devotion. A motion passed to adjourn and the meeting was adjourned with the Lord's Prayer.






