



Items needed for Fabric Kits for LWR:

-Two pieces of cotton or cottonblend fabric (no knits or 100% polyester); fabric should have no stains or holes and be cut into pieces measuring:

2-1/4" yards of 60" wide fabric, or 3 yards of 44" wide fabric, or 4 yards of 36" wide fabric

Two spools of neutral-colored, general purpose thread, 250-300 yards each.

Fold thread and one piece of fabric inside second piece and tie with yard, sturdy string, ribbon, or strip of fabric.

"I give you a new commandment, that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another."



Matthew 28:19-20

"Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, 20 and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you..."



These are: 1) Love God with your whole being.

- 2) Love and serve your neighbor in the way you would want to be treated
- 3) Love one another in the community of faith,

and 4) Go out into the world with the message and way of Jesus so others can become followers of Jesus through Baptism, faith and discipleship.

As we move forward in faith, I invite you to pray for the Holy Spirit's guidance and strength to seek to follow these commandments of Jesus.

CHURCH COUNCIL SUMMARIES: (3 meetings)

November 21, 2016, meeting:

MLLC Church Council met on Monday, November 21, 2016, at a6:15 p.m. with President Shayne Kirts presiding.

The devotion was given by Dana Smith, from the book Same Kind of Different As Me, and was about being thankful for everything in your life. Pastor Tinker gave the devotion at the December meeting.

Pastor Blair Lundborg gave a brief presentation to the Council on the topic of Mission Support and the church giving back. He also spoke about the contract MLLC and Waldeck Lutheran Church entered into.

In the contract, Waldeck Church is to pay to MLLC \$2,700.00 per month, and of this amount, \$760.00 goes to Pastor Tinker, and the remaining amount goes to the Church.


