About this book: In Life Together, Dietrich Bonhoeffer, renowned Lutheran Christian minister, professor, and author of The Cost of Discipleship, recounts his unique fellowship in an underground seminary during the Nazi years in Germany. Giving practical advice on how life together in Christ can be sustained in families and groups, Life Together is bread for all who are hungry for the real life of Christian fellowship.

About the author: Dietrich Bonhoeffer was born in Breslau on February 4, 1906. The son of a famous German psychiatrist, he studied in Berlin and New York City. He left the safety of America to return to Germany and continue his public repudiation of the Nazis, which led to his arrest in 1943. Linked to the group of conspirators whose attempted assassination of Hitler failed, he was hanged on April 9, 1945.

# Baptismal Anniversary Sundays

Starting January 10, 2016 By Pastor David Tinker



God loves us and we are ever thankful for the blessing of the gift of Holy Baptism. Starting in 2016 we will have a monthly celebration of the Baptismal Anniversaries of folks of MLLC who were baptized that month. This will be an ongoing celebration event each month for the years to come.

We begin this celebration on the festival of the Baptism of our Lord. That is January 10 this year. It is always the 1st Sunday after the Epiphany, which is January 6 each year.

#### How we will do this:

An invitation will be mailed to all honorees for that month, noting the special day.

We will have a brief recognition of Baptismal Anniversaries at worship. This will take place at the time of the Creed (or at another appropriate time when a baptism is scheduled for that Sunday).

Honorees for that month's Baptismal Anniversaries will be invited forward as a group. If mobility is a struggle for you, consider finding a seat near the front of the Sanctuary on that day. Note that nobody will be singled out to make a speech or anything like that.

A brief baptismal affirmation liturgy will take place. This will include an optional contact with the water in the baptismal font.

We will pray for the faith of the honorees that month. Honorees will then return to their places for the prayers and the remainder of the service.

# Campus Ministry Sunday – January 31, Worship at 9:00 a.m. By Pastor Mindy Roll, Lutheran Campus Pastor at Texas A&M and Blinn College

Howdy Martin Luther! On Sunday, January 31, get ready to have your pulpits Aggie-fied – it's Campus Ministry Sunday! As you may know, for the last three years now, Treehouse (the Lutheran Campus Ministry at Texas A&M and Blinn College) has sent out students to our College Station and Brenham-area churches at the end of January to share the good news of Jesus through the lens of the life-changing work of campus ministry. It's a nerveracking, joy-filled, and FUN experience for students, and we are grateful for the warm welcome our preachers always receive. Thank you for loving these students so well.

So, what is campus ministry? This is the biggest question I get as a campus pastor, and I sum it up like this: it's the place where the questioning faith of adolescence begins to mature into the complex, deep faith of adulthood. It's the place where questions about what I believe transform into questions about how to live a life of compelling discipleship. As such, Treehouse is about a few things: weekly Bible study where we come face-to-face with an always-surprising God; weekly worship where we come face-to-face with a challenging, welcoming community; and weekly service, where we come face-to-face with Jesus himself. These things together shape our students into disciples who have so much to teach the rest of the church (for they have taught me much!).

And who exactly is coming? TWO phenomenal Treehouse students will be co-preaching at Martin Luther on January 31. Generally, we like to pair an older, more confident student with a younger or newer-to-faith student. These pairs will have studied the text for several weeks, attended a preaching workshop, co-written a sermon together, and will have had the sermon reviewed. Most pairs will be accompanied by one of our great board members.



Wait! Are you a current student at A&M and Blinn or a soon-to-be freshman? We can't wait to meet you! Come introduce yourself to our preachers so we can get you connected to the ministry. Your life will never be the same. We mean it.

Again, thank you people of Martin Lutherfor all of your support of this vital ministry. Your encouragement, generosity, and prayers make a tremendous difference in the lives of so many students and young adults. This ministry happens because of you, and we are grateful.

#### **CHURCH COUNCIL SUMMARY:**

The Church Council of Martin Luther Lutheran Church of Carmine, Texas met for its monthly meeting in the church parlor on Monday December 21, 2015, at 6:15 p.m. The meeting was called to order by Council President Todd Dooley. Pastor David Tinker and seven Council members were present with two members absent. Todd Dooley provided the devotion.

The minutes for the November 16, 2015, Council meeting were presented. A motion passed to accept the minutes. The **Treasurer's Report** was presented. Year-to-date expenses ending November 30, 2015, for MLLC (not including MLLS) were \$395,331.60 of which \$158,749.97 were for the parsonage renovations. Total income year-to-date was \$237,290.49. Overall for the year-to-date, excluding expenses for the parsonage and multi-purpose building, the Church has a net loss of \$6,352.07.

For the month of November, 2015, MLLC expenses were \$28,841.20 and income was \$16,568.61. For the MLLS, total year-to-date expenses ending November 30, 2015, were \$164,508.93. Total year-to-date income for MLLS was \$154,369.83. For the month of November 2015, MLLS expenses were \$18,109.18 and income was \$13,501.91. A motion passed to accept the report as presented. Discussion was made concerning the budget for the parsonage. It is projected that the expenses for the parsonage will remain within the approved budget for the project.

Pastor David Tinker made the following report. The future wedding of Shelby Markwardt and Robert Vaughn is scheduled for July 30, 2016. Pastor continues to lead the adult Sunday School classes and Chapel with the MLLS students. Pastor attended several committee meetings in November as well as the Brazos Valley Hospice luncheon. Pastor continues to work on the webpage and he is working on plans for Baptismal Anniversary Sundays beginning in 2016. Confirmation class continues with Bethlehem Lutheran in Round Top. MLLC has two students in the program this year. Pastor will be on vacation from Dec. 26th - Jan. 2nd. Upcoming special dates: Dec. 24th - Christmas Eve service; Dec. 25th - Christmas Day service; Dec. 26th - no Saturday service; Jan. 10th - 1st Baptismal Anniversary Sunday; Jan. 26 -27th - Tri-Synodical Theological Conference in Arlington; Jan. 31st - Campus Ministry Sunday & New Member Reception; Feb. 6th - Shared Ministry event @ St. Paul in Shelby; & Feb. 10th - Lent begins with Ash Wednesday service @ 7pm.

The MLLS Day School reported enrollment numbers for November, 2015, were 24 full-time students and six part-time students. One staff member resigned and was replaced while another staff returned from maternity leave. November had three payroll periods. Fund Raiser orders were paid during November with money received

in October. Students are practicing for the Christmas program to be held on Dec. 4th.

The Worship Committee made the following report. The sign-up sheet for the December 20th carol service was filled. The service was a big success. The Prayer Chain is ready to activate again. The new lists have been mailed out and activated. Lent begins in February with Ash Wednesday service on February 10th. Lenten services will be held "in the round" again this year in the Fellowship Hall preceded by a meal by various groups. Date available to sign-up are Feb. 17th & 24th and March 2, 9, & 16th. The sign-up sheet will be available in the office. We will have "Rotating Pastors" again this year as well from neighboring congregations. The second Sunday of each month, we will be celebrating everyone's baptism for the month starting in January. Council discussed the idea of hosting a polka service sometime during the year separate from the Harvest Fest service.

The Christian Education Committee reported that the Sunday School program went very well. Amber Dooley thanked the Council for support their efforts. Outreach Committee reported that a new member reception will be planned for January 31st in conjunction with the Campus Ministry group presentation. The Property Committee reported that work continues at the parsonage and work has begun on the parking lot for the multipurpose building.


The Nominating Committee is seeking names for members to serve on the Council. Positions needing to be filled this year are: Vice-President elect, Council Secretary, and Stewardship Committee representative. No one has stepped up to fill these positions. Members are also sought for the Day School committee.

A preliminary annual budget for 2016 was discussed. More work needs to be done on the budget before Council can approve it for presentation to the congregation. MLLC staff bonuses were discussed at great length. A proposal was presented and passed to give MLLC staff bonuses which are all within the approved budgeted totals. The annual congregational meeting will be held following services on January 17<sup>th</sup>. All committee annual reports need to be submitted to the church office before January 5<sup>th</sup> to be prepared for the congregation.
