

Summer: Three sessions (June, July, August)


Fall: Three sessions (September through November)



PASTOR'S ARTICLE:

Ephesians 2:8-10: Saved by Grace, through Faith, for Service

God's Action and Our Calling – Part 3 of 6; Ephesians 2:8-10: Saved by Grace, through Faith, for Service---By Pastor David Tinker



Last month we looked into our first response to God's love. Pure and simple, it is to love God and to love others. Now we will look into God's major way we channel our love for others.

A significant passage for Lutherans, and for all Christians, is this powerful passage about God's grace for us. The Apostle Paul wrote: "8 For by grace you have been saved through faith, and this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God— 9 not the result of works, so that no one may boast. 10 For we are what he has made us, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand to be our way of life."

God's gift of salvation from sin, death and evil is the greatest gift of all. We mistakenly think this is just about a ticket to heavenly glory. That is missing so much of what God has done for us. We all too often disconnect God's grace from how we live today. St. Paul and Martin Luther both make strong connections between God's grace and

our lives today. Here is a summary: We are saved by Grace, through Faith, for Service.

God has done great things for us in Jesus Christ. Salvation includes our eternity with God beyond this earthly life. As Paul teaches here, salvation is also always about how we live now.

We are, in a sense, drawn out of the power of sin, and are brought into the life God wills for us now. Within our lives right now God acts to transform how we live, how we act, our attitudes and so much more.

Throughout our days God is working on us and through us. We are, as St. Paul tells us in Philippians 2:12b: you are working "out your own salvation with fear and trembling..." This means we are, founded on God's grace, growing into the persons God wills us to be. This is to become the people we were created to be. Paul tells us in Ephesians 2:10: "For we are what he has made us, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand to be our way of life."

God gives us the faith we need to trust in the work of Jesus. By this faith God works to restore us to be what we were to be in the beginning. We were designed for lives of good works. No, the good works themselves do no save us from our sin. The good works for our neighbors and for God's glory are an expression of God's restorative power in our lives.

We don't do good works to try to impress God or anybody else. We serve others, we honor the Lord, we share God's love, all because God has acted for us. We get to channel our response to God's grace through our actions of caring service to others. These actions can be either grand or small. The size and shape of Christian Service and Good Works doesn't matter. What matters is that God has been very good to us, and we are stirred to serve in response to that goodness.

We are saved by Grace, through Faith, for Service.

CHURCH COUNCIL SUMMARY

The Church Council of Martin
Luther Lutheran Church of Carmine,
Texas, met for its monthly meeting
in the church parlor on Monday June
15, 2015, at 6:15 p.m. The meeting
was called to order by Council
President Todd Dooley. Pastor
David Tinker and nine Council
members were present. Jessica
Weidemann provided the devotion.



The minutes for the May 18, 2015, Council meeting were presented. One minor correction was made to the minutes. A motion passed to accept the minutes.

The <u>Treasurer's Report</u> was presented. Year-to-date expenses ending May 31, 2015 for MLLC (not including MLLS) were \$169,251.80 of which \$60,116.86 were for the parsonage renovations. Total income year-to-date was \$107,690.53. For the month of May 2015 MLLC expenses were \$46,419.96 and income was \$21,860.78. For the MLLS, total year-to-date expenses ending May 31, 2015 were \$71,602.23. Total year-to-date income for MLLS was \$73,369.35. For the month of May 2015, MLLS expenses were \$13,481.62 and income was \$14,739.37. As of the end of May 2015 the General Fund checking account balance was \$7,637.63. A motion passed to accept the report as presented. It was discussed that the funds raised for the Jacob Family Relief Fund (\$3,360) will be paid to the family in the coming weeks.

Pastor David Tinker made the following report. There was one death in the congregation in May: Cliford "Cliff" Miller. The wedding of Sierra Kunkel & Alan Richard is scheduled for July 11th. Dates for photos for the upcoming photo

directory will be September 15-19th Pastor continues to lead the adult Sunday School class and Chapel with the MLLS students. Confirmation camp week was June 14-19th. Pastor attended several committee meetings in May and helped with the Jacob Family Fundraiser, Pastor attended the RT-C Graduation, the Carmine Cemetery Decoration service, and was the guest speaker at the RT-C Baccalaureate service. Pastor will be on vacation the weekend of July 25th & 26th. Pastor Bill Derrick will be our preacher and presiding minister that weekend. Upcoming special dates: June 21st – VBS installation, Mission and Ministry Building dedication, and the Father's Day Reception; June 22-26th – Vacation Bible School; June 28th - VBS Closing program at worship; July 12th (tentative) new member reception; August 2-7th -MLLC youth attending Lutherhill with youth from Bethlehem LC; August 22 & 23rd - LutherHill Director Matt Kindsvatter to preach at both service and will provide the Sunday School Lesson; August 30th-Rally Sunday and Water Fun Day; September 6th - Labor Day Sunday (Sunday School at 9am and Worship at 10:15am); October 4th - Synod staff visitor, Peggy Han, to preach at Sunday service; October 18th – Harvest Fest @ Carmine Hall: & November 8th - WELCA Thankoffering Service.

The MLLS Day School reported enrollment numbers for May, 2015, were 28 full-time students and 15 drop-in students. Jennifer Vaclavik and Kelli Meinholdt are doing the housekeeping and staff relief. Preschool graduation was held on May 22nd with 11 students graduating. Summer activities are in preparation.

The Christian Education Committee reported plans for VBS had been finalized. Lutherhill plans to teach Sunday School for our students on August 23rd. Rally Sunday will be August 30th which will include fun games and a water day for Sunday School students to close out the summer.

The Worship Committee reported that the additional microphones and equipment have been ordered.

The Outreach Committee reported they hosted the Mother's Day and Graduation receptions in May. The Committee would serve a Father's Day reception in conjunction with the dedication of the new Mission and Ministry Building on June 21st. The Committee will organize, serve, and host a breakfast for the RT-C and MLLS teachers and staff on August 20th at 8:30 a.m. in the fellowship hall. The new member reception is still pending. The Committee will help as needed with the Labor Day meal on September 6th. The domino group would meet in the new building once it was dedicated.

The Property Committee reported that the parsonage renovation is going well. The plumbing, electrical, and A/C rough-in work is almost complete. Renovations are still on track for an end-of-year completion despite the continued wet weather. The fridge in the Fellowship Hall is not working. It may need to be replaced.

A "thank you" note from Burton High School was read thanking our congregation for continuing to purchase an advertisement in their school's yearbook. A letter from "Upbring" – the new name for Lutheran Social Services was read seeking donations for flood victims in Central Texas. Further information is available at the Church office for anyone interested in donating to Upbring.

The next regular Council meeting was set for Monday July 20, 2015, at 6:15 p.m. Samantha Ullrich volunteered to provide the devotion and Amber Dooley volunteered to provide the devotion at the August meeting. A motion to adjourn passed and the meeting was adjourned with the Lord's Prayer.

July 20-24 will be "Safari" Week, and we will learn about animals such as giraffes, monkeys, and elephants.


July 27-31 will be "Fun in the Sun" Week, and we will learn about sun safety and sandy beaches.








What you need:

- 3. Pour into cup. Add ice and fish. Enjoy!




