SPECIAL CALLED CONGREGATIONAL MEETING, Sunday, July 3:

This meeting is for the purpose of voting on the approval of our congregation beginning a six-month trial contract basis with Waldeck Lutheran Church to share Pastor Tinker.

At the end of the six-month period, we will review this matter, and then decide if it is in the best interest of our congregation to continue to share Pastor Tinker on a more permanent basis, join a Shared Lutheran Ministry including MLLC, Waldeck Lutheran, Bethlehem Lutheran in Round Top, and St. Paul Lutheran in Shelby, or have Pastor Tinker serve our congregation only. Letters with more information on this have been made available to all members.

A committee is being formed between the four congregations to communicate happenings between all four churches, not to make any decisions. Each congregation appoints two members along with Pastor Tinker and Pastor Nedbalek. Blake Dooley and Shayne Kirts will serve for MLLC. The next committee meeting will be hosted by MLLC on Saturday, August 13, at 9:00 a.m.

Regarding Shared Ministry: The Church Council is seeking your questions, comments, and concerns specifically regarding the possible Shared Ministry Arrangement with Waldeck Lutheran Lchurch. These cards are due in the "Shared Ministry" box in the narthex by 6:00 p.m. on Monday, June 27, so that the Church Council can meet to review the cards and prepare meaningful responses for the congregation. These cards are in the pews and by the box in the narthex,

Church Council will meet Monday, <u>June 27</u>, from 6:00-7:00 p.m. to review the "concerns".


Egypt: Joseph's Journey from Prison to Palace
