Thank you for your generous gifts to LWR. I wish I could thank each of you individually for all those bars of soap, pencils, diapers, combs, or whatever gift you gave to LWR. Here is a list of what MLLC shipped *(on April 6, 2015)*.

22 quilts, 71 school kits, 21 personal care kits, 16 baby care kits, and two fabric kits, Soap-601. A total of over 730 bars of soap were collected.

MLLC also sent \$270.00 toward shipping of these items. Amazing!

Next year the emphasis will be on School Kits. I want to challenge MLLC to send 100 School Kits to LWR. Can we do this? If we can collect over 700 bars of soap, I think we can donate 100 School Kits. July is the month for collecting School Kits. Maybe, VBS will again help with this cause.

LWR just recently shipped over 9,000 quilts and over 1,000 Personal Care Kits to Nepal. We can and do make a difference in the world.



PASTOR'S ARTICLE:

God's Action and Our Calling - Part 2 of 6

1 John 4:19: Our Response to God's Love

Last month we looked into God's love for us. Pure and simple, it is God acting for us. Now we will look into our response to God's love.

We read in John's first letter, chapter 4, verse 19: "We love because he first loved us." To clarify we could say, "We love because God first loved us." This is the same form of love which is noted in John 3:16: "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life." This is the sacrificial, self-giving, care and goodness for others which God offers to all. The Apostle John is teaching us that we live out this same love for God and others which was first given to us.

This teaching is that God has done great things for us. God's love in action through Jesus Christ is abundant and overflowing. This abundant love of God spurs us on to follow the way of Jesus. We remember that Jesus exhibited God's love for us in many ways. Two of the most prominent ways are his washing of the Disciples' feet and his suffering and death on the cross. Because he has been so good to us, we now share that goodness with others.

This idea is not a new one with Jesus' ministry. Actually, the Covenant at Mt. Sinai with the Ten Commandments is a great example of God's love in action spurring his people on to love. The presentation of the Ten Commandments in Exodus 20 begins with an announcement of God's love in action: "Then God spoke all these words: I am the LORD your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery..." (Exodus 20:1-2a). It is only after the LORD has acted for the Hebrews that he calls on them to show love to God and to neighbor. The Hebrews could have said, "We love because the LORD loves us."

We today have all of this before us. We have God's abundant grace, mercy, forgiveness, and love. Because of us, we are empowered to take actions of self-giving love which benefit others. We give of ourselves because God first gave of himself for us. We love and serve God and neighbor because God has been to us, and because we are followers of Jesus who showed us the way. We love because he first loved us.

The Church Council of Martin Luther Lutheran Church of Carmine, Texas, met for its monthly meeting in the church parlor on Monday May 18, 2015, at 6:15 p.m. The meeting was called to order by Council President Todd Dooley. Pastor David Tinker and nine Council members were present. Ronnie Siptak provided the devotion.

The minutes for the April 20, 2015 Council meeting were presented. A motion passed to accept the minutes.

The <u>Treasurer's Report</u> was presented. Expenses for the month of April 2015 for MLLC (not including MLLS) were \$39,019.43 which included expenses of \$16,768.71 for the parsonage renovations. Total income for MLLC for the month of April 2015 was \$25,239.54. For the year-to-date ending April 30, 2015: total expenses for MLLC (not including MLLS) were \$122,831.34 & total income was \$85,829.75. For the MLLS expenses for the month of April 2015 were \$14,250.03 and total income was \$14,120.78. For the MLLS, total year-to-date ending April 30, 2015: expenses were \$58,120.61 and total income for MLLS was \$58,629.98. As of the end of April 2015 the General Fund checking account balance was \$1,962.84. A motion passed to accept the report as presented.

Pastor David Tinker made the following report. A letter of transfer to MLLC was received for Mike and Terry McIntosh. The dates for the photo directory picture taking will be September 15-19th.

Pastor continues to lead the adult and teen Sunday School classes and Chapel with the MLLS students. Confirmation class has concluded. Confirmation Day was May 3rd. He attended several committee meetings in April. He remains involved in the community by working with organization to organize and promote the fundraiser event for the Jacob Family. The MLLS Day School reported enrollment numbers for April 2015 were 29 full-time students and 13 drop-in students. Jennifer Vaclavik and Kelli Meinholdt serve as the housekeepers and staff relief. Students enjoyed an Easter Egg Hunt and parties on April 2nd. Picture Day was held on April 6th for a fundraiser. Students practiced for graduation and student recognition scheduled for May 22nd.

The Worship Committee reported the Altar Guild and Acolyte training was held after worship on April 19th with Susan Bathe and was a great success. The lapel microphone quote has been accepted: 2 Lavalier Wireless systems, 2 headsets, 1 cordless handheld mic, 2 microphone cables and installation. The quote was \$1,729.93. The Worship Committee contacted the Stewardship Committee to request Memorial Funds/ Designated Gifts to purchase the microphones which was approved. The Prayer Chain is still a work in progress. There are some volunteers but more are needed. The green altar parament was inspected. A decision was made to contact Darlene Etzel to see if she could repair the tassels and replace the stained fabric. Discussion was made concerning placement of the lectern during Praise Services. A request was made to place the lectern on the middle step. Labor Day Sunday is approaching and the Com-mittee requested to permanently change the time/order of services. Council members agreed to permanently change times on Labor Day Sunday: Sunday School at 9am and Church service at 10:15am. This would immediately be followed by a potluck luncheon.

The <u>Outreach Committee</u> reported they hosted a Mother's Day reception on May 10th. Upcoming receptions: Graduation reception - May 24th; Father's Day - June 21st; the new building and new member receptions are still pending. The Stewardship Committee reported the quote

of \$1,729.93 for the wireless microphones was accepted and will be paid for from Designated Gifts funding.

The <u>Property Committee</u> reported the forms for the sidewalk to the new building have been built, but we are waiting on better weather to pour the concrete. This will be done at the same time the garage slab is poured at the parsonage. The Committee approved the purchase of a steam mop to be used on the kitchen floor in the Fellowship Hall. Work is progressing at the parsonage. The Committee is accepting bids for work to be done on the grounds in front of the main doors to the Church building.

The gravel for the new parking lot in front of the multipurpose building is still on hold. It is planned to be completed once the weather and grounds improve. Robert and Karen Tappe requested release of membership to the Cowboy Church in Brenham.


