

The Brazos Cluster Women of the ELCA Spring Happening was held on April 30 at MLLC fellowship hall with the theme, "New Beginnings". The opening devotion, based on the theme verse, 2 Corinthians 5:17, was given by Deaconess Jennifer Tinker.

Special and inspiration speaker, Pastor Briana Merkle, shared her spiritual life from childhood to youth to young adult to seminary and on to her "new beginning" as associate pastor at St. Paul's Evangelical Lutheran Church in Brenham. She and her husband, Rev. Kyle Merkle, who is pastor at St. John's Lutheran Church of Prairie Hill, live in the Brenham area.

Hymns sung included "In Christ, a New Creation", "Coming Alive", and "Joyful, Joyful, We Adore Thee", accompanied by Nancy Eilers, pianist, who also played "Over the Rainbow" during our offering. SYNOD ASSEMBLY REPORT, 2016

The Gulf Coast Synod met in Assembly May 19-21, 2016, at the Hilton Houston North Conference Center. Our Voting Members/ Delegates this year were Pastor David Tinker and Deaconess Jennifer Tinker. We are eligible to bring our pastor, plus three members each year.

The theme of the Assembly was *from the Edges*. The guest speaker at our Assembly was the Rev. Dr. John Arthur Nunes. Rev. Nunes is the president-elect of Concordia College beginning his service this July. He currently serves as the Jochum Chair at Valparaiso University. Formerly, Rev. Nunes was the President and CEO of Lutheran World Relief. He addressed the theme of connecting with people at the edges of life and society with the message and ministry of Jesus Christ.

The assembly included service projects, synod council elections, and information sharing regarding our common life and mission as the Gulf Coast Synod of ELCA congregations.

A highlight of the assembly was the final worship service. This was a bilingual (Mandarin Chinese and English). Our Gulf Coast Synod includes congregations which worship and study in many languages, including English, Mandarin Chinese, Swahili, Spanish, etc. This is like how many Lutheran Churches founded by earlier immigrants to the USA offered worship and study in German, Swedish, Danish, etc.






