



#### Church Council Summary (By Pastor Tinker)

February 2016

Beginning this month the Church Council will offer this summary of actions at its most recent meeting for the newsletter each month. A complete copy of minutes will be available in the church office.

The Church Council met on Monday, <u>February 15, 2016.</u>

The minutes were approved, following minor corrections.

The treasurer reported that \$10,000 was borrowed from memorial funds for short term expenses. These funds are in the process of being paid back.

The Martin Luther Lutheran School Fundraiser was a success. Thanks to all who helped in any way. The approximate profit for MLLS is \$5200.

The Worship Committee receive council approval to change the worship times for Confirmation Sunday (1st Sunday in May each year) and Labor Day Weekend Sunday. This will be the schedule for those Sundays only:

Confirmation Sunday and Labor Day Sunday schedule change – SS at 9:00 a.m.; Worship at 10:15 a.m.

This has been the practice of the congregation for some years, but the committee wanted to make a formal request of this change.

The council worked out the details for a congregational meeting and special letter regarding the increased and unexpected expenses for the parsonage remodel. The revised amount is \$10,000-13,000 above the previously approved budget (\$180,000). This would include items needed to prepare the house for use by the pastor. The meeting will be after worship on Sunday, March 13.

The Evangelical Lutheran Church of the Central African Republic is our companion synod. It has an estimated 55,000 members in 300 congregations. The church has a seminary, a Bible school to train catechists, a strong women's organization, and a youth program. The church helps meet the urgent need for safe drinking water and adequate food; works to lower the rate of infant and

the rate of infant and maternal mortality. combat malaria, AIDS. and other illnesses: provides basic education. develops women's leadership, and more. Pastors serve several congregations in scattered villages, rotating among them to officiate at communion and perform baptisms. Our synod has been involved with this program since the 1990's.
