


On May 19, 1902, Rev. Harder and 17 members of the Carmine Church met to organize the new



Report on Brazos Cluster WELCA Spring Happening



This gathering was held on Saturday, March 25, at Elizabeth Lutheran Church, Caldwell, with the theme, "God is Good", with 39 in attendance. (Leonita Sanders and Dianne Sager attended from MLLC). Pastor Richard Brunk gave the opening devotion on the theme verse, Mark 10:19: God is good at all times.

The guest speaker was Tracy Sebesta, advocate for CASA (Court-Appointed Special Advocate), who gave an informative talk about CASA and what they do for abused children. She also spoke on how importand advocates are for the system and how badly they are needed.

The offering given was designated for CASA, and physical offering of canned goods was brought for the Food Pantry of Elizabeth Lutheran.

During the business meeting,
Dianne Sager, for Mission Action,
gave a report on Lutheran World
Relief with collection being on
April 17 at Zionsville. She
reported that \$.86 of every dollar
donated to the LWR goes to help
in the field. Carolyn Muske,
synod representative, reported on
the quantity of LWR items (quilts,
blankets, school kits, personal care

kits, fabric kits, baby care kits, and soap), that was shipped to 16 countries, and that 534,144 people received benefit from these shipments in 2016.

Maxine Schwarze will remain the Coordinator for one more year; Carol Naegeli will take the position of Vice-Coordinator; Judy Matula accepted the position of Communicator; Leonita Sanders as the Financial Secretary; and Joyce Schaefer accepted the position of Mission Reports.

The Texas-Louisiana Gulf Coast Synod WELCA will have the synod convention on Saturday, August 26, 2017, at St. Paul's Lutheran Church, Brenham. The Triennial Convention will be in Minneapolis on July13-16, 2017.

AUTOMATED AND ONLINE OFFERINGS By Pastor David Tinker

In May, we will be rolling out our new program for automated and online offerings. Through a cooperative agreement with Thrivent Financial and Vanco Services, we will be able to provide a number of connection points for both ongoing and onetime giving to God and his ministries through MLLC. Note that these are purely *voluntary* and no one will be required to use these services. Also, this service is not intended to be the limit of how you make your offerings to God through MLLC. Many people have made the choice to use automated and online payments for a wide variety of charities, business and services. It makes sense that those individuals would like to do the same with their offerings to the Lord.

Here are some of the opportunities you have to use this service:

*The program will enable you to set up transfers from your bank account to the MLLC bank account.

*These transfers can be made from your bank account, debit card or credit card.

*These scheduled giving times can be weekly, twice monthly, monthly, etc.

*This will provide you with the ability to keep up with your offerings even when you can't be at worship due to travel, work, health, etc.

*You can set a standard amount for these regular times.

*You can set up any number of special schedules for regular giving.

- *One-time gifts will always be an option through the website.




Make this craft to display a bit of springtime year-round!
