
T November 10 is the 533rd anniversary of the birth of Martin Luther in the year 1483.



If not for you, these quilters and these donors, this would not be possible. Sedalia Ullrich & Joys Baird traveled to Katy on Thursday, October 6, and delivered the 26 quilts to Lydia Danvet and Rina John at the Center.

The quilts and personal hygiene products are given to new residents of the Center. Sixty girls between the ages to 12 and 17 reside at the Center.

This includes girls who have been removed from their homes, orphaned, or in foster placement for a variety of reasons, most due to histories of severe abuse or neglect. They receive on-site medical and nursing care, on-campus education, preparation for adult living, community outings, yoga, gardening, art, and spiritual care including chapel services and Bible study. Girls often discover their special interests and talent in this healthy and safe setting.

So, those who quilt, donate materials, quilting supplies, and give money to support this project are doing God's Work With Your Hands and Heart. THANK YOU!

Report on TX/LA Gulf Coast Synod of Women of the ELCA September. 16-18, 2016, Memorial Lutheran Church, Texas City, Texas, with the theme, "A Coastal Affair" (Total attendance of 88.)

The Friday evening convention opened with guest speaker, Rev. Bro. Christopher Markert from the ELCA Synod office. He spoke on <u>The Order of the Franciscan Monks</u>, (a completely new concept to me) with a casual get-acquainted reception following.

On Saturday morning, attendees registered and Churchwide Representative, Ely Smith, Executive Board Treasurer of Fircrest, Washington, opened the session.

The <u>Business Session</u> for delegates and other voting members was held while other participants enjoyed displays/vendors/and workshops. All officer reports, minutes, treasurer's report, and incidentals were reviewed.

Officers/Committee Members elected (2-year term) are: Carolyn Muske (Vice President); Angela Bell (Secretary); Board members (2-year term) MiLisa Gaertner, Mary Markowich, and Andi Wiltse.

Board member for 1-year term was Pam Naranjo; Nominating Committee members: Katy Gau, Beverly Tomsic and Colette Wunderlich.

Triennial voting members: MiLisa Gaertner, Rissi Snelgrove, and Angela Bell. Alternates are Barbara Sue Beall, Beverly Jean Tomsic, and Pamela Naranjo.

Offerings collected: Love offering (½ to CWO and ½ to SWO) - \$2,351; Silent auction - \$1,259.00; Quilt raffle - \$636.00. (Colette won the baby quilt).

The Water Project (physical offering to Water to Thrive) brought in \$5,665.95. (One well/water system costs \$5,000). One well provides safe, clean water to more than 250 people for 20 years.

The WELCA Synod gave \$18,000 to the project in 2015. Katie's Fund (endowment, established in 1997) total in 2014 was \$1,000,000, and \$1.2 million in 2015.



Jessica Weidemann announced that there was a sign up sheet in the office for Advent meals.


New Business:

We will be planting broccoli, radishes, carrots, mesclun mix (a colorful, curly lettuce with different shapes), and tomatoes.


