Brazos Cluster Fall Happening report:

The Brazos Cluster Women of the ELCA Fall Happening was held on Saturday, October 21, 2017, at Immanuel Lutheran Church, Wiedeville, near Brenham with the theme, "Spreading God's Word" and thirty-two women attending. Nadine Rau welcomed the group and the opening hymn, *Spirit, Spirit of Gentleness*, was sung.



Pastor Charles Parnell of Salem Evangelical Lutheran Church gave the opening devotion, based on 1 Peter, verses 24 and 25, emphasizing that we should put our trust in the Word of God. The hymn, *I, the Lord of Sea & Sky*, was then sung.

Leonita Sanders introduced the guest speaker, Marilyn Snell, an active member of Our Saviour's Lutheran Church, College Station, and the Texas Representative for (SRM) Spirit Renewal Ministries/Bibles for Africa. She spoke on the need to broaden the support base of Bibles for Africa by supplying Bibles for the missionary work in Eastern Africa, Uganda, and Burandi and that God is calling us to open our hearts and spread the Gospel. The offering taken was given to purchase Bibles and to provide Biblical training and counseling on a long-term basis to pastors.

Maxine Schwarze, president, called the business meeting to order. The communicator, Judy Matula, presented the roll call and the minutes of the previous spring gathering. Leonita Sanders gave the financial report and handed out the unit financial requests for 2018. The mission action and community officer, Joyce Schaefer, presented information on Lutheran World Relief, with the collection day being on April 2, 2018, at Zion Lutheran Church, Brenham. The women were encouraged to apply for the Thrivent Choice dollars to help with purchasing items for Lutheran World Relief and fundraisers. The nomination committee to seek women for the offices of president and treasurer, to be elected at the Spring Gathering, are the WELCA units of Elizabeth Lutheran, Caldwell; Martin Luther Lutheran. Carmine; and Salem Evangelical Lutheran, Brenham. The synodical report followed with Mary Markowich. Synod representative, sharing information from the last board meeting and emphasized the availability of the synod scholarship fund with sheets being given out for this purpose. The 2018 synodical convention will be held on September 15th at House of Prayer Lutheran Church in Houston. The new synod president, MiLisa Gaertner, of LaGrange, was introduced, and she is looking forward to serving the next two years.

She encouraged the women to join the Facebook page, Women of the ELCA, to receive up-to-date happenings and told of the automatic giving program, Faithful Friends.

The Fall Happening closed with The Lord's Prayer and the hymn, *Great Is Thy Faithfulness*. The physical offering of non-perishable food items was given to Bread Partners of Washington County.

The Immanuel Lutheran Women of the ELCA served a delicious brunch during registration as well as a sandwich buffet lunch. A big thank you was given to them for hosting the event that was thoroughly enjoyed by those in attendance.

Christmas Boxes for Port of Houston Seafarers By Pastor David Tinker

MEN IN MISSION

The Packing Day for the Christmas Boxes for the Seafarers is Monday,

November 27, at 7:00 p.m. We will prepare the boxes in the Parlor, near the church office. All are invited to participate in this event sponsored by the Men in Mission of MLLC.

We are looking forward to another generous and joyful year of preparing and sending the Christmas Boxes for the Seafarers at the Port of Houston. A few years ago we revived this ministry and it has gone quite well. The Men in Mission organization of MLLC organizes this each year. They are thankful for the congregational partnership in this caring ministry. Here is a bit of history of our preparation and sending of boxes:

In 2014 there were 34 boxes assembled.

In 2015 there were 50 boxes assembled.

In 2016 there were 49 boxes assembled.

The Port of Houston Chaplains are our ambassadors to these seafarers. They visit the ships and bring the boxes to the crews. On their web site the chaplains tell us: "Crew sizes vary between 8 and 30, with an average number of 22 seafarers to gift per ship. In 2015, we placed 12,278 gifts on board 538 ships which had seafarers from 65 different countries! These gifts had been donated to the seafarers by 246 churches and organizations! The Christmas boxes are personally carried to each ship by your staff of Port Chaplains."

With our work together at MLLC we can help reach even more with the love of Jesus Christ.

For this year (2017), please gather items such as these for the men on the ships - you can buy things throughout the year and drop these off at any time. There is a large blue storage bin for this purpose in the room directly across from the church office:




What you need:
