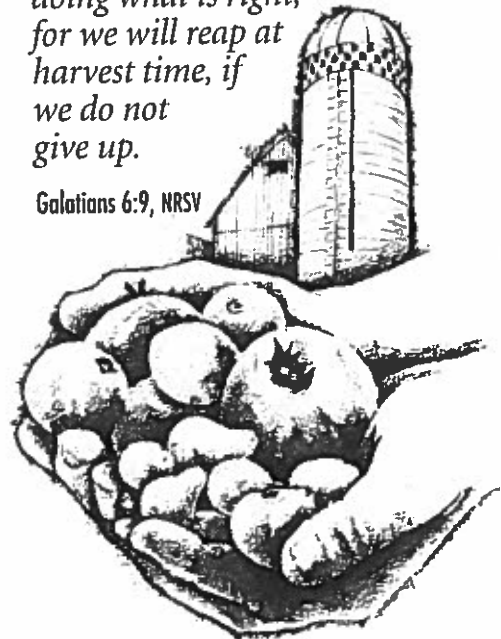

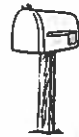

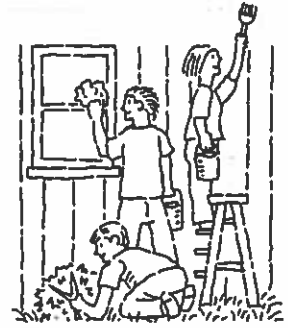

CHURCH COUNCIL SUMMARIES:



✓ RESULTS OF THE CALLED MEETING, SUNDAY, SEPTEMBER 13:

Regarding the replacing of two heating and air conditioning units in the sanctuary, a bid proposal was presented from Steve Leppard to replace two Carrier brand units in the sanctuary at a total cost of \$12,500. Discussion followed as to funding for the project that would come from the Building Fund and from Designated or General Gifts accounts. Donations would be accepted and appreciated. The units would be replaced as soon as possible. Motion was made and carried to replace the two heating and air conditioning units.

✓ COUNCIL MEETING OF SEPTEMBER 21:

The Church Council of Martin Luther Lutheran Church of Carmine, Texas met for its monthly meeting in the church parlor on Monday September 21, 2015, at 6:15 p.m. The meeting was called to order by Council President Todd

Dooley. Pastor David Tinker and seven Council members were present. Two members were absent. Shayne Kirts provided the devotion.

A special presentation was given to Council by Ruth Kelling from the Synod Global Mission Board. She gave information on the Health Center at Gallo in the Central African Republic. She encouraged our congregation to make an offering to support their mission there. Council later discussed this and requested the Worship Committee to consider this as a future special offering or noisy offering recipient.

The minutes for the August 17, 2015 Council meeting and the September 13, 2015 special called meeting were presented. A motion passed to accept the minutes.

The **Treasurer's Report** was presented. Year-to-date expenses ending August 31, 2015 for MLLC (not including MLLS) were \$286,516.46 of which \$116,649.37 were for the parsonage renovations. Total income year-to-date was \$166,411.18. For the month of August 2015 MLLC expenses were \$39,885.47 and income was \$16,344.17. A special note was made that for the year, net income for MLLC (minus expenses for the parsonage and multipurpose building) was a positive \$2,143.70. For the MLLS, total year-to-date expenses ending August 31, 2015 were \$118,443.53. Total year-to-date income for MLLS was \$113,611.12. For the month of August 2015, MLLS expenses were \$13,129.86 and income was \$15,642.30. As of the end of August 2015, the General Fund checking account balance was \$9,774.37. A motion passed to accept the report as presented.

Pastor Tinker reported he is seeking more information about the Lutheran Foundation of the Southwest speaking

to Council and the Endowment Committee. There is one future wedding scheduled: Shelby Markwardt & Robert Vaughn possibly in July, 2016. Memorial service for Sandy Pierce will be on Saturday, October 24th, with luncheon to follow.

Pastor continues to lead the adult Sunday School class and Chapel with the MLLS students. Pastor attended several committee and planning meetings. He continues to update the Church's website. Confirmation class has begun. This is in cooperation with Bethlehem Lutheran of Round Top. There are three MLLC students in the program. There has been a change of schedule with Peggy Hahn from the Synod office who was to preach on October 4th. This has been postponed until November 22nd. Upcoming special dates: October 18th – Harvest Fest @ Carmine Hall; November 1st – All Saints Sunday (possible new member Sunday); November 8th – WELCA Thankoffering Service; November 22nd - Peggy Hahn from the Synod office to preach.

MLLS Day School reported enrollment numbers for August, 2015, were 26 full-time students and eight drop-in students. The new school year began on September 1st. This means new teachers and classrooms for students. It was a successful day. Picture day was held on September 11th as a fund raiser. Beginning in October we will be selling Yankee Candles as a fund raiser.

Christian Education Committee reported they will have helpers from the older age group including LYO take part in the activity section for the Fall Festival which will include a free art station with take along bag, fish pond, and bounce house.

These activities will take place during the time of lunch immediately following church and will continue until the raffle begins.

Christmas program practice will begin on Sunday, November 15th and the program will be held on December 13th with a birthday party for Jesus and brunch immediately following church service.

The **Worship Committee** reported that half of the additional microphones and equipment have been received but the headsets are on back order. They will be paid for once received. The Labor Day Sunday potluck meal was a success with 61 members attending the meal. A big “thank you” to all who helped. Door prizes were given away. We also collected \$131 for Treehouse Ministries. Tone Chimes start on September 20th with six returning members and one new member. Esther Kelley’s Sunday School class will be baking bread again for communion this year. We are planning a Carol Service on December 20th during church.

The **Stewardship Committee** reported that they had \$430 come in for the Camping Fund. Two changes were made to the Time and Talents sheets to include helping with the Harvest Fest Raffle and helping with Memorials during funerals. The Harvest Festival is being planned for October 18th. They received the poster and post cards at a cost of \$161.30. Raffle tickets are ready for distribution to anyone wishing to sell them. They will be on sale on the day of the Festival. They are \$5 each and are available through the Church office, Stewardship Committee members, and the Church Council members. The Committee has decided to have a raffle instead of an auction. Donations for the silent auction are still being accepted. Contact any member of the Stewardship Committee or Church office to make donations. Collette Wunderlich volunteered to take care of the silent auction since she has done this before. Meal tickets are available for \$10 each which will include fried chicken, potatoes, and green beans.

In Old Business; the parsonage renovations are coming along and should be completed towards the end of the year. Pastor Tinker would like to have a dedication of the building when it is completed. The Housing Committee will discuss with Pastor the details of moving his family into the parsonage once it is ready. The pictorial directory is being worked on and is in the final stages. It was briefly discussed that the replacement of the heating/air conditioning units in the sanctuary has yet to be scheduled.

Pastor Tinker presented information concerning changing the long distance carrier service at the Church. The current plan is unreasonably expensive while there are other less expensive options. Pastor will continue to research these options and will report back to Council.

Pastor presented information on upcoming vacancies on the Church Council and procedures for a nominating committee. There are two positions that must be filled this next year: President Elect and Secretary. Other positions are up for re-elections for so desired. There are also committees needing members and our congregation needs to elect voting members to attend the 2016 Annual Synod Assembly which will be held in May in North Houston. Congregational members are asked to consider serving on the Council and on committees needing representation.

The next regular Council meeting was set for Monday October 19, 2015 at 6:15PM. Todd Dooley volunteered to provide the devotion. A motion passed to adjourn and the meeting was adjourned with the Lord’s Prayer.

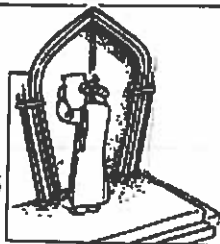

PASTOR'S ARTICLE

What are Luther's 95
Theses about?

October marks the time when we remember the Reformation and the beginning of the Protestant movement. We remember the work of Martin Luther for the sake of the church and the Gospel of Jesus. The event which sparked the Reformation was when Martin Luther posted the 95 Theses.

Martin Luther posted his 95 Theses on the Castle Church door on October 31, 1517 in Wittenberg, Germany. This action was meant to stir up discussion among those who read the 95 Theses. He posted these at the Castle Church door on this date because the local ruler, Frederick the Wise, was hosting a festival of relics starting November 1 (All Saints Day). The charge for admission to the festival of relics was the purchase of Indulgences of various values.

The selling of indulgences was, in part, to raise the large sum necessary to build Saint Peter's Basilica at the Vatican. An indulgence would grant the purchaser a reduction of his or her time in purgatory. The larger the sum paid, the more time removed from the person's time in purgatory.

Luther's 95 Theses addressed three major themes.

Which Theses are associated with what Theme is from Roland Bainton's biography of Martin Luther: [Here I Stand?](#) Some of the theses may apply to more than one of Bainton's points.

Bainton's Points:

- Objection to the Avowed Object of the Expenditure – Opposition to the financing of the building of Saint Peter's Basilica at the Vatican
50, 51, 59, 66, 70, 86
- Denial of the Powers of the Pope over Purgatory
1-40, 48, 49, 52-67, 69-71, 73-85, 87-93, 95
- A consideration of the Welfare of the Sinner – It is better for the Christian to give money to help a person in need than to pay for a false sense of security

27-29, 31, 32, 35, 41-48, 66-68, 70-72, 84, 95

Copies of all of Martin Luther's 95 Theses are available at the church office and in the Narthex. These are in the form of a more modern translation from the original Latin.

I look forward to seeing you on the weekend of October 24-25 as we remember the Reformation. Worship on Saturday at 6:00 p.m., Sunday at 9:00 a.m.

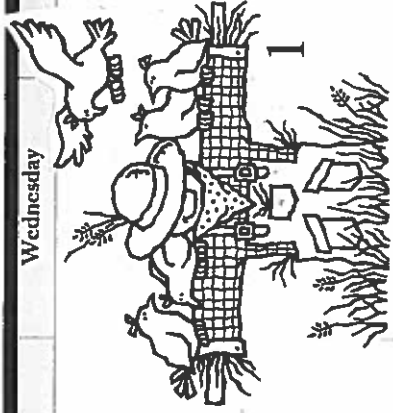
