

The Rishmawi Family has been designated as the representative for these wonderful Christian artisans and has been authorized to show their olive wood carvings.

We invite you to visit their display and view some of the finest handcrafts available from the Holy Land. This Family strives to bring these fine carvings to our church. You can view these beautiful items On-Line at www.bethlehem-art.com/.

These olive wood crafts are also available for purchase by the people of MLLC. There is no obligation to purchase anything from the visitors.

The tradition of Olive Wood carvings in the Holy Land has been handed down from father to son since the 12<sup>th</sup> century. Due to the difficulties the last few years in the Middle East, tourism has been dramatically reduced and these folks have suffered greatly. This is causing the Christian community to immigrate to different countries leaving the Christian population at 2% today from 25% ten years ago.

"We call on our churches worldwide to recognize that the very presence of the Christian communities in the Holy Land is threatened by the severity of the present conflict and by the economic devastation the conflict has caused. When the Mother Church is endangered, the entire Churches must be involved" - The Christian Bishops of Jerusalem.

### CHURCH COUNCIL SUMMARY:

September 15, 2014

The Church Council of Martin Luther Lutheran Church of Carmine, Texas met for its monthly meeting in the church parlor on Monday September 15, 2014 at 6:15 p.m. The meeting was called to order by Council President Ronnie Eckert. Seven Council members and Pastor Tinker were present with two members absent. Dennis Smith provided the devotion.

The minutes for the August 18, 2014
Council meeting were presented. A
motion passed to accept the minutes. The
Treasurer's Report was presented. For the
month of August 2014, total expenses for
MLLC (not including MLLS) were
\$38,903.73 which included a large
expense for the new building project.
Total income was \$24,712.16. For the
MLLS, total expenses for August 2014
were \$14,733.08. Total income for MLLS
was \$11,895.00. As of August 31, 2014
the General Fund checking account
balance was \$5,145.86. A motion passed
to accept the report as presented.

Pastor Tinker presented the following report. There are three weddings scheduled: Haley Woelfel & Colt Kokel - April 18, 2015; Autumn Pfeffer & Nicholas Lehmann- April 25, 2015; and Sierra Kunkel - July 11, 2015. A new adult member, Kay Schmidt, will be received on Saturday, September 27<sup>th</sup>.

Upcoming baptism of Nicole Wright, infant daughter of Heather Woelfel Wright, will be October 11<sup>th</sup>. Pastor continues to lead the adult and teen Sunday School classes and Chapel with the MLLS students.

Confirmation class resumed with six students from MLLC and three from Bethlehem Lutheran Church in Round Top.

Congregation

Pastor attended several committee meetings in August. He met with upcoming wedding couples for instruction and planning and is meeting with baptismal family to prepare for the baptism. He spent a day with the youth of MLLC who were at LutherHill Camp.

Pastor helped host the Back-to-School Teacher Breakfast. He is working on the MLLC website by adding new photos, and is attending the local Lion's Club and is the 1st Vice-President. Pastor reported these upcoming special dates: Sept. 23-25<sup>th</sup> Pastor at Pastor's Retreat; Oct. 5th Synod staff visit; Oct. 11th-Synod Leaders gathering in Brenham; Oct. 19th – Harvest Festival; Nov. 9th - Thankoffering Sunday; Nov. 30th -First Sunday of Advent & set up of Sanctuary; Dec. 1st -Decorate Sanctuary for Advent and Christmas; Dec. 3<sup>rd</sup> - First Wednesday in Advent; Dec. 5th-MLLS Christmas program at 7pm; & Dec. 7th MLLC Sunday School Christmas Program & congregational brunch.

The MLLS Day School reported enroll-ment numbers for August 2014 were 21 full-time students and 6 drop-in students, Additional students would begin in September. Numerous tuition payments have not been received in full for August. The curriculum was ordered and paid for the 9 month school year. The new school year to begin September 2<sup>nd</sup>. Picture day was scheduled for Friday September 12 which also serves as a fund raiser. There have been two recent staff resignations.

The Worship Committee reported that the Labor Day Sunday was a big success. A big "Thank You" goes out to the Outreach Committee for taking care of the meat. A big "Thank You" also goes out the congregational members who provided side dishes and desserts. The Committee is looking at handling communion at the Harvest Fest in the style of intinction. Pastor is still researching the purchase of new lapel microphones.

A letter will be written addressing the Altar Guild procedures. A request has been made to ask the Usher Teams to let the communion set up know, during the offering, how many people are in church for communion. The Committee discussed the "Welcome to all Visitors" statement in the bulletin regarding communion. It was decided that Pastor would revise the statement and if anyone had suggestions to direct those questions to Pastor Tinker.

The <u>Outreach Committee</u> hosted the Back-to-School breakfast on August 24th. The Committee purchased BBQ brisket and helped the Worship Committee serve it for the Labor Day pot-luck meal. There were several pounds of left-over meat that was frozen and will be served at an Advent meal. The Committee hosted the Grandparents' Day reception on September 7th. The Committee is still looking for a food service cart.

The Property Committee reported that various insurance companies are being reviewed for property and liability insurance needs for the church and day-school. The new building is being insulated and sheetrock installed. The stump in front of the church building has been ground into mulch and is free to anyone who wants it. Once it is cleaned up, plans will begin to rework that area. The roof in the day-school foyer area is

leaking again. Rauch Sheet Metal was contacted to make repairs. The existing stove/range in the parsonage will be moved to the new building and a new unit will be purchased for the parsonage when repairs are completed on that facility.

The air conditioning unit in the fellowship hall is being replaced. The Committee will be looking into prices of furnishings for the new building. This information will be available at the Harvest Fest for anyone wanting to donate specific items.

The Stewardship Committee reported that they discussed the Harvest Fest at their previous meeting. They will meet again on October 13th at 6:30pm to discuss last minute details. The Committee is working on publicity and mailings for the Harvest Fest. Auction items are still needed and welcomed for the Harvest Fest. If anyone has items to donate, please let the Committee or the Church office know. The Committee will meet on Saturday October 18th at 9am to move items to the Carmine Hall for the Harvest Fest. Time and Talent Sheets will have a new column next year dedicated to Harvest Fest preparation and activities.

In <u>Old Business</u>, Council discussed that the Housing Committee will soon pick a color for the concrete stain for the new building. It is expected that the building will not be completed for another 6-8 weeks. There will be a dedication service once completed.

Meal tickets for the Harvest Fest are being printed and will be ready for purchase at \$9 per ticket. Congregational members are asked to donate dessert items for the meal. The bid for the church's annual insurance policy was discussed. A motion passed to approve the policy with an "umbrella" of \$3 million.

In <u>New Business</u>, Council discussed that a Nominating Committee is being formed to seek nominations for Council Members for the upcoming year. Nominations are being sought for Vice-President,

Treasurer, Property Chair, & Christian Education. Anyone interested is encouraged to contact the church office or Pastor Tinker, Council also discussed the possibility of having a new pictorial directory done. It has been almost four years since the last directory was completed. Pastor is gathering information on this. Council discussed placing an advertisement in the Burton ISD yearbook. It was determined that this was already a budgeted item and it was okay to proceed with the advertisement.

A "Thank You" note is being sent to Steve Leopard for all of his work on the multiple air conditioner repairs around the church buildings. The Gulf Coast Gathering of Synod leaders will be in Brenham on October 11<sup>th</sup>.

Eldon Mikeska agreed to provide the devotional at the October meeting. The next regular Council meeting was set for Monday October 20, 2014 at 6:15PM and the meeting was adjourned with the Lord's Prayer.
