CHURCH COUNCIL SUMMARY:

The Church Council of Martin Luther Lutheran Church of Carmine, Texas, met for its monthly meeting in the church parlor on Monday, August 17, 2015, at 6:15 p.m. The meeting was called to order by Council President Todd Dooley. Pastor David Tinker and nine Council members were present. Amber Dooley provided the devotion.



The minutes for the July 20, 2015 Council meeting were presented. A motion passed to accept the minutes. The Treasurer's Report was presented. Year-to-date expenses ending July 31, 2015, for MLLC (not including MLLS) were \$246,630.99 of which \$93,864.26 were for the parsonage renovations. Total income year-to-date was \$150,067.01. For the month of July. 2015, MLLC expenses were \$34,904.82 and income was \$27,268.58. For the MLLS, total year-to-date expenses ending July 31, 2015, were \$105,313.67. Total year-to-date income for MLLS was \$97,968.82. For the month of July, 2015, MLLS expenses were \$14,125.84 and income was \$11,454.04. As of the end of July, 2015, the General Fund checking account balance was \$11,182.38. A motion passed to accept the report as presented.

Pastor David Tinker made the following report. He requested that the Council and the congregation think about what we enjoy about our life together at MLLC. He would like us to share 1-3 items of note and share with him. These items will help us reflect on the good things we have at MLLC and will be a part of our looking to the future of the congregation in the coming years.

There will be a free Wills Service provided by Phillips and Luckey Funeral Home for church members. There will be a brief presentation during an upcoming Sunday service. Global Mission Committee of the Synod would like to speak with Council to share information on Mission connections for congregations. Lizabeth Johnson of Lutheran Foundation of the Southwest would like to speak to Council about a presentation to the congregation.

Release of memberships: Wendy Turner, along with sons, Dylan and Dusti Marburger & Tammy Fischer. "Brick" and Debby Peele are seeking transfer of their membersip into MLLC.

Dates for photos for the upcoming photo directory will be September 16-19th. Sign up has begun. Pastor offered early Holy Communion at the Carmine Firemen's Feast.

He continues to lead the adult Sunday School class and Chapel with the MLLS students. He visited Lutherhill camp and attended several committee meetings in July. Upcoming special dates: August 22 & 23 - Lutherhill Director, Matt Kindsvatter, to preach at both services and will provide the Sunday School lesson; August 30th - Rally Sunday and Water Fun Day; September 6th - Labor Day Sunday (Sunday School at 9 am and Worship at 10:15 am); October 4th - synod staff visitor, Peggy Hahn, to preach at Sunday service; October 18th -Harvest Fest at Carmine Hall; & November 8th - WELCA Thankoffering Service.

MLLS Day School reported enrollment numbers for July, 2015, were 35 full-time students and seven drop-in students. One part-time and two full-time babies were enrolled to begin in August. The new school year begins on September 1. This means new teachers and classrooms for students.

Jennifer Vaclavik and Kelli Meinholdt are doing the housekeeping and staff relief. Summer activities are in progress and vary from water day, outdoor games, etc.

<u>The Christian Education Committee</u> reported Lutherhill staff will be visiting August 23rd to lead a skit during worship and will lead Sunday School classes. Rally Sunday is August 30th with fun activities for students.

Sunday School classes have been set: Amy Dooley and Gwen Stork - Preschool; Amber Dooley and Melissa Wickel - Kinder. & 1st grade; Mia Williams and Michelle Kohring - 2nd & 3rd grades; Susan Ray - 4th-6th grades; and Esther Kelley - 7th grade and up.

Worship Committee reported that the additional microphones and equipment have been ordered but the shipment date is unknown at this time. We are prepared and ready for Lutherhill services on August 22nd & 23rd. Labor Day Sunday potluck meal will be pork roast. They have been purchased and a set-up day has been scheduled for September 5th at 2:00 pm. Announcements are in the bulletin and were also placed in the newsletter. A "Cowboy" theme has been requested for the Harvest Festival this year. Homecoming presentations begin at 9:30 immediately followed by worship. The meal will be from 11 am-1pm.

The Outreach Committee will organize, serve, and host a breakfast for the RT-C and MLLS teachers and staff on August 20th at 8:30 am in the fellowship hall. The congregation is asked to help by providing food and drinks as well as serving. The Property Committee reported work at the parsonage continues. All subcontractor rough-in work is completed and inspected. Insulation has been installed. Sheetwork work is finished and interior painting has started.

The Stewardship Committee reported that the Harvest Festival is being planned for October 18th. The Committee has decided to have a raffle instead of an auction. Donations of "large ticket" items and donations of money for gift cards are requested. The Committee is hoping to offer 10-20 quality items for raffle.

These items are needed prior to September 19th in order to print and sell raffle tickets in a timely manner prior to the date of the Harvest Festival. Contact any member of the Stewardship Committee or church office to make donations.

The Port of Houston Chaplains are our ambassadors to these seafarers. They visit the ships and bring the boxes to the crews.

On their web site the chaplains tell us: "Crew sizes vary between 8 and 30, with an average number of 22 seafarers to gift per ship. In 2014, we placed 11,392 gifts on board 512 ships which had seafarers from 69 different countries! These gifts had been donated to the seafarers by 223 churches and organizations! The Christmas boxes are personally carried to each ship by your staff of Port Chaplains." Their web site is: http://www.venturecd.net/SeafarersCenter.org/Home_Page.htm



LABOR DAY WEEKEND WORSHIP, By Pastor David Tinker

The beginning of September brings a Holy Day of sorts for all of us. Labor Day is a civic holiday to celebrate the opportunity for work. As Lutheran Christians we go deeper with this and view all work as part of God's calling and his provision of our daily bread. All Christians are doing the work of God, regardless of where or what they do in their honorable vocation in life.

Some time ago I discovered a concise statement written by a fellow Lutheran pastor regarding the Lutheran Christian understanding of vocation. Here is an excerpt of what Pastor Samuel Schuldheisz, Redeemer Lutheran Church (LC-MS) of Huntington Beach, CA, writes, "... our earthly vocations or 'stations in life' as Luther called them, are fruits of our heavenly calling as God's children in baptism. The purpose of vocation is to love and serve the neighbor in the particular stations in life that God has called us to whether we are a husband, wife, father, mother, son, daughter, teacher, student, etc. We don't live life hidden in a corner. This was the danger of many priests and monks in the Reformation era. Many taught that the highest form of Christian living was to become a monk and live in a monastery. Luther wrote extensively against this false teaching as he re-discovered the doctrine of vocation and began to teach and preach about its necessity in the Christian

Luther taught that on one level, there is no difference between monk and magistrate or priest and plumber. Each Christian is called according to God's Word and Spirit, regardless of what their status in society is. This means that God's calling of a Roadkill Collector is just as holy as God's calling to be a pastor.

The difference is the office and duties that are unique to each vocation. For example, the pastoral office is not the office of school teacher, just as the office of father is not the same as the office of mother. Each vocation, or calling from God, has particular and unique duties attached to it. This is how God works in, with, and under the ordinary means of this life to accomplish His good and gracious will, physically and spiritually."

To celebrate this blessing of vocation, we will be taking the Sunday of Labor Day

weekend to give thanks for the blessings of daily bread, of work, of school, of family, etc. To enhance our time together you are invited to wear the clothes or uniform of your current or pre-retirement vocation. No matter what, know that we will be giving thanks for and honoring all that God has called each of us to do as part of his greater work in the world. Know that who each of us is and what God has called and equipped each of us to do is important. On Sunday, September 6, we will take time to give thanks for all which God calls and equips us to do. As part of this we will have a potluck lunch following worship. Bring a salad, side dish or dessert to share.

We look forward to seeing you September 6 and on other Sundays in the weeks


