


4) Bring or send a card or letter to express your gratitude.

The best way to make sure you and I can meet up about something is to contact me directly to arrange for a time together. I will always do my best to find a mutually agreeable time to meet. I will gladly meet at the church, a home, a hospital or care facility, or any other workable and appropriate location.

I strive to be as reachable as possible. Here are various ways to reach me. Even if I can't immediately answer your call or see your message, please leave a message so I know you are contacting me. Also note, cell phone service is not always very good at either of the two churches. Therefore, please always leave a message if you call my cell phone, but only connect with the voice mail service.

I will offer general office hours at the MLLC office on these days. Week to week these have been the times I have already been at the office anyway. This is not a limit of my availability for connection and ministry, but merely a standard set of times when I plan be in the office.

Monday--9:30 a.m. – 12:30 p.m. Tuesday--9:30 a.m. – 12:30 p.m. Thursday--9:30 a.m. – 12:30 p.m. My main office is at MLLC, but I will also spend time most every week at the Waldeck church office. At this

most every week at the Waldeck church office. At this point I plan to be at the Waldeck Lutheran Church office on Wednesdays, 10 a.m. – 12 noon.

My normal day off each week continues to be Friday.

There are occasional meetings and commitments which will sometimes cut into these hours. Even when I am away from the office on some mornings, I am still reachable. At least once or twice a month I attend the Lutheran Pastors meetings earlier on Tuesdays. There are also occasions a pastoral emergency, pre-surgery visits with families at a hospital, or other situations which will arise which would likely reduce my time at the office on these days. Even with these realities, day to day and week to week I will continue to be at the church office as I have been. If you stop by the office at any time I am not available, please tell the office staff that you are trying to reach me. That way I will know of your message and I will be able to follow up and reconnect with you.

Remember: The best way to make sure you and I can meet up about something is to contact me directly to arrange for a time together. I will always do my best to find a mutually agreeable time to meet. Frequently this ends up being on relatively short notice. In all this, let us strive to love God, to love our neighbors, and to love one another.

School Board representative presented information regarding MLLS Director Interviews to take place on Tuesday evening, August 16.

The School Board is working on details regarding pay scale and other financial issues regarding the potential new hire for the MLLS Director. Discussion with council occurred to make suggestions for certain details in the pay package.

Suggested salary range: \$27,000-30,000/year, according to experience. Two weeks vacation (pending decision by school board). It was moved by Cindy, and seconded by Jessica, to offer this salary range for the new MLLS Director. The motion passed.

- Work with church council to set up a Mutual Ministry Committee.




