
Colette gave the offering mediation on Advent and Christmas and the meeting closed with The Lord's Prayer.

November 20, 2017

Members present: Blake Dooley, Cheryl Etzel, Brick Peele, Jessica Weidemann, Karen Roemer, Anita Drydale, Dana Smith, Cindy Weidemann, and Tim Sanders. Absent: Pastor David Tinker.

The meeting was called to order by Blake Dooley, Council President. The devotion was presented by Jessica Weidemann. The minutes from the October meeting and Treasurer's Report were approved.

Committee reports:

Christian Education Committee reported that Sunday School practices were underway, and they discussed the Jesus' Birthday potluck lunch.

Worship Committee discussed the Christmas carol service to be on December 17. Waldeck hosts the Advent services. MLLC had the opportunity to serve a meal at the December 13 Advent service. LYO would be doing the candlelight service on December 24.

Property Committee reported that repair of stucco on southwest corner of fellowship hall was pending. Anchor hardware was located for repair of loose pews. The fellowship hall stained glass windows were reviewed with Diane Tovey. Five stained glass window panes are cracked and need to be replaced. Specific measurements will be confirmed to determine cost estimates. LED lights in the fellowship hall would be replaced in December.

Installation of LED bulbs in the church's main hall, office and bathrooms with quote of \$663.00 was approved. Installation of 40-ft. antenna tower behind parsonage was approved.

Stewardship Committee discussed the offering envelope process and decided to continue with the bi-monthly mailing. Three-five families set up an auto draft. End-of-year reports will be ready by January 31. Set up meeting schedule for 2018, discussed financial review. Per bylaws, review should be two stewardship members and one congregation member. 2018 Review Committee members are Marlene Waak (1st term); Connie Peters (2nd term); and Karen Roemer (3rd term).

<u>Dayschool Committee</u> discussed afterschool care only. Set up fees are nominal. Approve for 2018-19 school year; follow student calendar or RT-C. Review after six-month probation period for next school year. Then, present to congregation at the annual meeting.

Parameters to be determined for presentation to congregation at the annual meeting.

PLAN FOR A PROSPECTIVE MLLC AFTER SCHOOL PROGRAM FOR 2018-2019



The MLLC Church Council met on Monday, November 20, 2017. At the meeting the possibility of a MLLC After School Program was discussed. Based on the information provided by Buck Williams, the After School Investigative Committee Chair, the Council agreed to present an After School Program for the 2018-2019 school year to the congregation with the below guidelines for their vote of approval or disapproval at the annual congregational meeting on January 14, 2018.

Council Guidelines for the potential After School Program

Part 1

Choice of two Director/Teacher plans based on number of students

Plan A: 1 State Certified Director (must be certified prior to hire date) & 1 Teacher

Minimum of 10 paying students – Maximum of 20 students

-OR-

Plan B: 1 State Certified Director (must be certified prior to hire date) & 2 Teachers

Minimum of 21 paying students – Maximum of 35 students

Along with a Director and Teacher(s), there must be a minimum of 2 state approved substitute teachers that have completed a background check.

- * Staff will be paid at the designated rate provided by Buck Williams in the financial plan (this plan will be provided in the Annual Report for 2017 which will be made available the week prior to the annual meeting).
- * No overtime pay
- * No paid sick leave or vacation

Part 2

The After School Program will follow the "Student Calendar" for Round Top-Carmine ISD. It will only be open the days that students are attending school at Round Top-Carmine ISD.

Part 3

This plan will be voted on at the 2018 Annual Congregational Meeting for the 2018-2019 school year. Future school years will be voted for approval each year at the Annual Congregational Meeting (i.e. approval for the 2019-2020 school year would be voted on at the annual meeting in 2019)

Part 4

If the plan is approved by the congregation at the annual meeting, the church council will appoint a 5-member School Board to oversee the After School Program, along with the church council. The council appointed School Board will include 1 church council member.




