March 24 - Saturday Palm Sunday worship with communion, 6:00 p.m.


March 25 - Palm Sunday

March 29-- Maundy Thursday Worship with Holy Communion starts at 7:30 p.m. at MLLC. This is also First Communion Day for Makayla Smith, Jake Smith, and Matthew Roemer. 

Holy Week - Celebrating the Saving Work of Jesus Christ, By Pastor David Tinker



We invite you to be part of our celebrations and observances as we remember all the great things Jesus has done for us. Every year around this time we gather to ponder anew the suffering, death, and resurrection of Jesus. We get to revisit the central parts of our life and faith with him. Everything else in our life and faith makes sense and matters because of the things we ponder this week. Each service has a focus on the various actions and events in this final week of Jesus' ministry on earth.

Palm Sunday reenacts Jesus' Triumphal Entry into Jerusalem. Maundy Thursday revisits the major actions of Jesus at the Last Supper with his Disciples. These include the washing of the Disciples' Feet, the Command to Love, the Institution of the Holy Communion, and the Arrest of Jesus.

Good Friday invites us to gather at the Cross of Christ. On the Cross he suffers and dies for the forgiveness of our sin.

On Holy Saturday we gather for the Great Vigil of Easter. In this time we gather with the followers of Jesus to wait for the fulfillment of his promise to Rise from the dead. In this service we light a new fire in hope of the Kesurrection. We tell the stories of faith from the Old Testament. We celebrate the gift of Baptism which is our holy connection to the death and resurrection of Jesus. In the end we renew our commitment to follow Jesus as we celebrate the Lord's Supper at the beginning of our Resurrection Celebration.

Early on Sunday we gather in the Carmine Cemetery for our Easter Sunrise Service. This is an ancient tradition of Christians. Our brothers and sisters in the faith have gathered in cemeteries early on Easter Sunday since the earliest days of the Church. We do this to reconnect with the place of Jesus' Resurrection. He was raised from the dead in a graveyard of sorts, the borrowed tomb in which Jesus' body was placed. It was early in the morning on the first day of the week, as we read in John chapter 20.

Later that morning we celebrate with the whole Church that Jesus Christ has been raised from the dead.

You are encouraged to make the time to gather with God's people during this special time of year. Even if you are not available for all of these services, plan to make time for God and his people in the weeks to come for worship at our regular weekend times.

Committee Reports

Outreach Committee: The Lenten meal would be served on March 21, along with the Stewardship Committee. Mother's Day reception will be held after church on May 13.

Christian Education Committee: Members will participate in the palm processional during worship on Palm Sunday, March 25. Easter plans include whole-group Sunday School during the regular time with a lesson/activity, games and snacks. The Easter egg hunt for all children in attendance will follow worship. The VBS package is back-ordered but should arrive in time...Volunteers are needed and welcome!

Worship Committee: They have prices for the items needed for acolytes (gloves), candle lighters and replacement cylinders for aisle candles in the amount of \$359.90. All was approved to move forward with the purchase. They discussed Holy week and decided on light refreshments before the service as a fellowship opportunity. Help is needed to fix/build new candle holders for the candles that line the aisles for special events. Discussion was had about the purchase of new microphone clips for the Pastor and the Assistant to wear, and training for our sound system was discussed. Brick and Pastor will realign the projector in the sanctuary.

Property Committee discussed the following:

Striping in the parking lot is completed.

--MLLC sign post at the corner of Augsburg and Centennial Streets have been repainted. Two orders were obtained for replacement signs at \$203 each and \$91.25 each (+tax). Motion was made and carried to accept the \$93.25 bid.

-- A quote was received from Ambrose Furniture in Bryan to recover ten parlor chairs with dark vinyl-type fabric - \$2,357.66.

--Fellowship Hall stained glass windows need to be repaired/replaced. Options for addressing issue will be reviewed for presentation to the Church

--The Committee is following up on repair of stucco

on southwest corner of Fellowship Hall.

--Fourteen fluorescent bulbs were replaced in light fixtures in the sanctuary balcony.
--Approval was received for phase 1 of bulb

replacement and will commence (MLLC main hall/offices/restrooms).

--Roof leak in storage closet – temp patch eliminated leaks during minor rain events; more severe rain events still display some leakage. --Removal of water well equip/buildings on the

church property pending committee coordination.
--The draft of cleaning duties list.
--Replacement of A/C filters in Fellowship Hall and

Sacristy. --Sheetrock repair in ceiling and misc. painting.

--Maintenance of church grounds on-going. --Propane tank behind playground—not level. Repairs pending.

--Connect/repair flex duct in the attic over the Fellowship Hall pending

--Bull rock placement to address erosion at the rear of the school building - ongoing --Vent screens for Fellowship Hall crawl space openings – construction pending.

Stewardship Committee had no update.

Dayschool Committee: The Committee has met three times since January to discuss the formation of the School Board, advertising for the after-school program, the June 18th deadline, and potential candidates for director, teachers, and substitutes. The Committee approved five people to serve on the School Board. The volunteers for the Board are Buck Williams, Melissa Smith, Joey Pohl, Amy Dooley, and RaChelle Kuecker. Church Council will vote on accepting Board members once term limits are established. A \$300 budget is required for advertising in local papers was approved.

AED (defibrillator) machine has arrived. The location for installation and training were discussed.

A thank-you note was received from AMEN for the \$600 donation to the emergency fund.

Tina will present the devotion at the next meeting -Monday, April 16, at 6:15 p.m.



CROSS CRAFT

Make this special cross as a reminder of Jesus' death and resurrection.



What you need:

- Adult help
- Piece of wood
- 5 nails
- Hammer
- 2 balls of yarn (blue and yellow)

What you do:

- 1. Hammer the nails into the wood to form a cross shape (see example).
- 2. Tie the blue yarn to the bottom nail. Wrap it up and around the top nail and back down to the bottom nail. Then wrap it around the middle nail and around the side nails. Repeat until the yarn is wrapped about halfway up the exposed nails.
- 3. Repeat step two with the yellow yarn. Wrap it around the nails until only the heads are visible.
