

They lodged in a downtown Houston hotel, and traveled by train each day to the NRG Stadium and NRG park for the various activities. There were various service/learning projects for the youths to do. Some included hurricane, cleanup, packing and sorting food for food banks, and packing school backpacks to help students who could not afford school supplies.

One of the side benefits of the event were reunions and new connections with Christian friends from around Texas and the nation. Miles and Jennifer enjoyed seeing friends from other congregations as well as meeting new friends.

The next ELCA National Youth Gathering will be in 2021 in Minneapolis, Minnesota. Miles will still be eligible to attend, and he plans to be there in three years. He appreciates the prayers and support of the people and youths of MLLC during his participation in the gathering.

(From Interchange)—Repentance is theme of Gather's fall Bible study

Repentance is one of the most powerful acts of a person or a church, making possible not only forgiveness but also reconciliation. This fall, Gather magazine (www.gathermagazine.org) will explore what repentance means for Lutheran Christians in a three-part Bible study. Written by the Rev. Meghan Johnston Aelabouni, this Bible study focuses on the role of repentance in our faith, our relationships and the church. Here's a preview: September

Time after time: Turning to God

"Return to the Lord, your God, for he is gracious and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love." With these words, the prophet Joel reminds us that repentance is nothing to be afraid of—for when we turn to God, we find grace. What does it mean to (re)turn to God with all our hearts, and how do we do it?

October

If I could turn back time: Turning to others When Zacchaeus met Jesus, he was moved to give half of his wealth to the poor and to make amends with those he had defrauded. Why? In the Gospels, Jesus' call to repent-ance is a call to turn back to the ways of God's reign on earth: justice, peace, and mercy for the neighbor and the community. What does repentance look like in our relationships?

November

Turning points: Turning as the church to the world

The word repentance often refers to an invitation that brings people into the church. But what happens when the church turns outward to the world? When the church has been complicit in abuse, racism, anti-Semitism and other atti-tudes and practices that lead away from God's reign, what happens when the church repents?



Automated and Online Giving





The Online Giving system at our church web site mllccarmine.com has been up and running for several months now. This is a supplement to our longstanding system of giving offerings through the offering plate at worship each weekend.

Through a cooperative agreement with Thrivent Financial and Vanco Payment Solutions we are able to provide a number of connection points for both ongoing and one time giving to God and his ministries through MLLC. Note that these are purely voluntary and no one will be required to use these services. Also, this service is not intended to be the limit of how you make your offerings to God through MLLC. It is important to note that many people have made the choice to use automated and online payments for a wide variety of charities, business and services. It makes sense that those individuals would like the opportunity to do the same with their offerings to the Lord through their church.

The main page for using the online giving is: mllccarmine.com/online-giving

This will provide a link to the special MLLC giving page with Vanco Payment Solutions.

You will have an option of setting up a user name and account while at this site.

If you prefer to use a printed form these are available at the church office or on the web site. Simply fill it out and bring the form to the church office. The office staff will take care of entering your information into the secure web site so your ongoing or one-time gift can happen.

Here are some of the opportunities you have to use this service:

- *The system is set up to receive gifts for general fund, memorials, synod benevolences, building, AMEN Food Pantry, Lutheran Youth Organization, Vacation Bible School, Christian Education, ELCA World Hunger, Brenham Mission Society, Treehouse Lutheran Campus Ministry, Noisy Offering, and other funds can be added as we have need.
- *The program will enable you to set up transfers to the MLLC bank account. These transfers can be made from your bank account (checking or savings), debit card or credit card. Visa, MasterCard, Discover and American Express are all accepted in this system. There is an option on the web site for you to include an extra gift to cover the cost of accepting a credit card.
- *These scheduled giving times can be a single gift, or weekly, twice monthly, monthly, etc.
- *This will provide you with the ability to keep up with your offerings even when you can't be at worship due to travel, work, health, etc.
- *You can set a standard amount for these regular times.
- *You can set up any number of special schedules for regular giving.
- *There will be a mobile friendly version of the web site so you can use your mobile device to make offering.
- *One time gifts will always be an option through the web site.

*All offerings will be credited to your name, just as when you use your offering envelope or write a check.




