The meeting was called to order by President Colette. The minutes of the January general meeting and special meeting were approved as presented as well as the treasurer's report. The following reports were given: Bold Women's Day, observed on February 25, honored Bible women as well as women that we know. The nursing home parties will be in July at Care Inn, La Grange; in October at Genesis Oakland Manor, Giddings; and in December at Kruse Village, Brenham. Communion and visits to nursing homes and assisted living center in La Grange will be in October. Funeral serving was shared with the families of Gladys Koether, Carol Sommerfeld, Thomas Kmiec, and Melissa Wickel. Several changes were noted for the funeral serving committees.

The WELCA salad banquet report was given. The Thankoffering service will be on November 11 followed by the turkey and dressing meal catered by Mantey Catering. Yearbook planning for 2019 will begin in October and distributed in December. Quilting, fleece blanket tying, and assembly of kits, baby kits, fabric kits, school kits, personal care kits, for Lutheran World Relief is an ongoing project with the shipment date of April 22, 2019, at Zionsville. Quilting is also done for Camp For All and Krause Center. Mother's Day offering for Krause Center was sent for \$100. A.M.E.N. Ingatherings continue in August and November. Envelopes for offering for the Synod Convention at House of Prayer Lutheran Church, Houston, on September 15 will be handed out on August 26 and September 2. PASTOR'S ARTICLE

Dear Friends in Christ,

As Christian Disciples we get to know and to serve a generous God. We read the following in James 1:17-18:

"Every generous act of giving, with every perfect gift, is from above, coming down from the Father of lights, with whom there is no variation or shadow due to change. In fulfillment of his own purpose he gave us birth by the word of truth, so that we would become a kind of first fruits of his creatures."

This passage, along with the entirety of Scripture, points to God's generosity, and then to our response to this generosity. God has been generous in creating this world and giving us our lives. The Lord has given his very self to us through Jesus' suffering, death on the cross, and resurrection. God's Word, our daily bread, our Spiritual Giftedness, our holy purpose in life, and our sure and certain hope for the future are all aspects of God's goodness and generosity.

There is a way in which each of us can be generous. I invite you to be generous in saying "Thank you" to those who serve God and Church. Each week when you are at worship watch who does something to aid our worship, such as ushers, readers, musicians, singers, acolytes, etc. After worship make some time to offer a friendly handshake and say a brief thank you to at least one person who has served. As you take this weekly risk, consider how you might offer encouragement and friendship to more folks the next time you are at worship. Make it a joyful habit of offering encouragement and thanks to those who serve, and always give thanks to God for the blessings of this community of disciples.

Secondly, as we head into the second half of the calendar year, I invite you to take a look at how you have been doing with your offerings. Ask yourself these questions:

- 1) Have I been generous to God and Church?
- 2) Have I kept up with my plan for giving for the year?

- 3) Have my circumstances changed this year so that I might adjust up or down what I am able to pass on to God's mission?
- 4) In what ways can I be more generous than I would normally be?
- 5) What are my plans for giving in the remainder of 2018?
- 6) Have I considered percentage giving (giving based on how God provides for my weekly, monthly or annual income)?

Think about these questions, and the encouragement above these, and look to how you might joyfully live a generous life.

MLLC sign post (Augsburg and Centennial Streets) installed 5/26/18. Approved by Council. Photocells on MLLC church announcement board & other external spotlights are inoperative – repair to subject cells pending.

Quote to recover 10 parlor chairs with dark vinyl type fabric rec'd from Ambrose Furniture in Bryan - \$2,357.66; quote from Church Lane Upholstery/Ledbetter; Brenda Dunlap pending. Key Box @ Fellowship Hall modified with webbing to avoid dropping; small hook also added to store door key in box; same modification made to new key box & carport doors.

Ongoing:

Replacement of defective fluorescent lamps.
Replacement of A/C filters in Fellowship Hall & Sacristy.
Sheetrock repair in ceiling & misc. painting when
possible. Maintenance of church grounds. Propane




