Giving Thanks for Daily Bread By Pastor David Tinker

As we gather this Autumn for our various Thanksgiving celebrations, we are reminded again that our Lord has been abundantly generous in his great provision for us. Since my youth I have frequently looked to Psalm 100 as part of my guidance for giving thanks. Here is that short psalm: 100:1 Make a joyful noise to the Lord, all the earth. 2 Worship the Lord with gladness; come into his presence with singing. 3 Know that the Lord is God. It is he that made us, and we are his; we are his people, and the sheep of his pasture. 4 Enter his gates with thanksgiving, and his courts with praise. Give thanks to him. bless his name. 5 For the Lord is good; his steadfast love endures forever. and his faithfulness to all generations.

In revisiting our faith during this or any time of year we get to start with giving thanks to God. In my faith life everything begins and




ends with this opportunity to connect with God. Central to my giving thanks is this truth as expressed in verse 5 of the psalm above: "For the Lord is good; his steadfast love endures forever, and his faithfulness to all generations." It is also expressed in this way in other scriptures, such as Psalm 145:8, where we read: "8 The Lord is gracious and merciful, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love."

At Thanksgiving we especially give thanks for our daily bread. Here is what Martin Luther notes about what our daily bread is. We read from his small catechism, The Lord's Prayer, 4th Petition: "What then does "daily bread" mean? Everything included in the necessities and nourishment for our bodies, such as food, drink, clothing, shoes, house, farm, fields, livestock, money, property, an upright spouse, upright children, upright members of the

household, upright and faithful rulers, good government, good weather, peace, health, decency, honor, good friends, faithful neighbors, and the like."

In short, we believe that God is the provider of everything. This also includes our talents and abilities to innovate, to work, to design, and to manage God's good provision. God continues to be very good to his created people.

As you gather at various times on and around our national day of Thanksgiving, remember all that God has done and provided. Remember to pause for prayers of thanksgiving on and around Thanksgiving Day. Remember that we offer the Thanksgiving Eve service on Wednesday, November 21, at 7:00 p.m. at Waldeck Evangelical Lutheran Church. This is a Crossroads Shared Lutheran Ministry, Four-Church event.

This event was held at House of Prayer Lutheran Church in Houston with over 100 attending. The theme, "Grace Changes Everything", was based on Ephesians 2:6-10. The keynote speaker was Pastor Janell Rozek Hooper of Houston, part-time campus pastor for Sanctuary (Houston Lutheran Campus Ministry) and author of "Heaven on Earth: Studies in Matthew". Other speakers included Rev. Michael Rinehart, Bishop; Linda Post Bushkofsky, Executive Director of Women of the ELCA; and Keala Simoes, Churchwide Representative & Executive Board Member of Women of the ELCA. Rev. Nancy Simpson of Baytown served as Chaplain and

presented the Friday night devotion.

The Space City Sound Chorus and the Pearland High School Choir Booster Club presented entertainment on Friday night. Fellowship, food, and a cardmaking workshop were enjoyed on Friday evening as well.

We are looking forward to another generous and joyful year of preparing and sending the Christmas boxes for the Seafarers at the Port of Houston. A few years ago we revived this ministry and it has gone quite well. The Men in Mission organization of MLLC organizes this each year. They are thankful for the congregational partnership in this caring ministry.

The items will be collected throughout November, up to Monday, November 26, at MLLC. After that date, these wrapped boxes will be delivered to the Port of Houston Seafarers Center. The Port of Houston Chaplains at the Center are our ambassadors to these seafarers.

They visit the ships and bring the boxes to the crews. With our work together at MLLC, we can help reach even more with the love of Jesus Christ.

For this year (2018), please gather items such as these for the men on the ships – you can buy things throughout the year and drop these off at any time.

There is a large blue storage bin for this purpose in the room directly across from the church office. Our goal in 2018 is to pack and deliver 80 boxes. (The Men in Mission Group does not need boxes this year. These were provided by a store in Brenham. See the rest of this list for requested items:)
