From Pastor Tinker -Advent Wednesday Services: Our Advent Series this year will be "Christmas According to St. Mark". The services will be on three Wednesdays in December: 12/5, 12/12, and 12/19. The meal will be at 6:00 p.m., and the service will be at 7:00 p.m. All events will be held in the fellowship hall. We will welcome our friends from our Crossroads Shared Lutheran Ministries congregations: Waldeck, Round Top, and Shelby. Worship Committee & Men in Mission serve hamburgers on December 5; Stewardship & Outreach serve on the 12th; and Waldeck members serve on the 19th.

St. Mark's Gospel book is the only one of the four Gospel

Advent is the season of preparation not only for the celebration of Jesus' birth but for his promised return. (See page 2 for Pastor Tinker's article on "Celebrating the 12 Days of Christmas".)

books which does not have an overt teaching about the Incarnation and birth of Jesus Christ. Luke chapters 1 and 2, and Matthew chapters 1 and 2, have the story of the conception, birth and early life of Jesus the Messiah. John has the grand theological statement about how the Jesus, the Living Word of God took on flesh and lived among us. Mark just says who the book is about, and then starts when Jesus and John the Baptist are about age 30. During this Advent we will see how the Gospel of Mark, though not containing these narratives, does point to the same themes.

Celebrating the 12 Days of Christmas by Pastor David Tinker



When are the 12 Days of Christmas?

The 12 Days of Christmas are the days of the Christmas Season. These are the days between the Nativity of our Lord (December 25) and the Epiphany of our Lord (January 6). There are 2 traditions of counting these 12 Days of Christmas. One tradition is that the 12 Days of Christmas start on Christmas Day, and conclude on "Twelfth Night", which is January 5. The second tradition is that the 12 Days of Christmas begin on December 26, and run through January 6. "Twelfth Night" would then be January 6. Despite the promotions and activity of our culture, the Christian "Christmas Season" begins on Christmas Day, rather than during the time leading up to Christmas.

Celebrating the 12 Days of Christmas

Here are some ways to mark the 12 Days of Christmas in your home and daily life.

-- Daily read something in the Bible about the birth and youth of Jesus. Look especially in Matthew chapters 1-2, and Luke chapter 2.

-- For fun with your family sing the popular song, "The

Twelve Days of Christmas" -- "on the first day of Christmas my true love gave to me.." Maybe do only the total number of days which have passed. Only on January 5 or 6, depending on how you count these days, would you sing all twelve verses. Another option would be to play a recording of someone singing this popular song.

-- Tell others about the 12 Days of Christmas, such as in conversation, letters, e-mail, or on social media sites

such as Twitter, Facebook, Instagram, etc.

-- Use 12 candles to count off the days during a meal or at devotions. One more candle is lit each day until all are lit on January 5th or 6th.

-- Keep your Christmas tree up until at least January 6.

-- Send your Christmas cards during this time, and possibly note the 12 Days of Christmas in your letter to family and friends.

-- Attend worship at Martin Luther Lutheran Church in Carmine on the two weekends which always occur in the 12 Days of Christmas. These will be on December 30 and January 6 for this season (2018-2019). Some folks pull back from worship during this time and miss out on a joyful time of the year at church.

-- Schedule Christmas Parties during this time. You will be less stressed and it will give your friends another

chance to get together for joyful fellowship.

Special Days during the 12 Days of Christmas *December 26 – The Feast of St. Stephen, Deacon and Martyr. Read about his ministry in Acts chapters 6 and 7.

*December 27 – The Feast of St. John, Apostle and Evangelist. Read one of the books connected to his ministry, such as the Gospel of John, the three letters of John, and Revelation.

*December 28 – Remembrance of the Holy Innocents of Bethlehem, Martyrs. Read about these victims of tyranny in Matthew chapter 2, especially verses 16-18. *December 31 – New Year's Eve – a chance to reflect on God's grace for you during this past year. *January 1 – The Name of Jesus. On this day we remember Jesus' 8th day. Read about this in Luke 2:21.

This is when his name was announced in a public way. *January 6 – The Epiphany of our Lord. We will have more about this in the January 2019 newsletter.

The meeting was called to order at 6:27 p.m. by Tim. The devotion was presented by Tim.

The minutes and treasurer's report from the October Church Council meeting were approved.

Pastor's Report
All four congregations in the Crossroads Shared Lutheran Ministry have approved participating in the shared worship service at Lutherhill. This will take place Sunday, February 3. A planning committee for this event is being formed. Likely meeting date is Monday, December 10, at 7:00 p.m. at Bethlehem in Round Top.

Recent Wedding: For Waldeck at MLLC: Cari Meinke and Britt Harper – on October 20. There are no more weddings currently on the calendar.

Confirmation Sunday at MLLC is scheduled for May 5. We have four students preparing for being confirmed on that Sunday. Classes will resume in January.

Bethlehem – Round Top and St. Paul – Shelby will participate in the Thanksgiving Eve service together with MLLC and Waldeck on Wednesday, November 21, at 7:00 p.m. at Waldeck. These congregations will also attend the Advent Services at MLLC – December 5, 12, and 19.

Motion to approve up to five personal days (Saturdays) moved by Buck with a second by Cindy. All approved.

Lent: Rotation of Pastors with the Shared Ministry to begin March 15th. Currently participating are Swiss Alp, Greenvine, Waldeck, Carmine, Round Top, Shelby and La Grange.

Lent Services schedule: Carmine 1, 3, and 5th. Waldeck 2 and 4th.
