




# LUTHER'S LETTER

FOUR-CHURCH WORSHIP SERVICE (Martin Luther Lutheran Church of Carmine; Waldeck Lutheran Church; Bethlehem Lutheran Church of Round Top, and St. Paul Lutheran Church of Shelby) – February 3, at Lutherhill, Carby Chapel – (There will be no worship services on that Sunday at any of the four churches. We are worshiping together at Lutherhill.) Please offer a ride to friends or relatives who would like to attend, but are unable to drive.

The service will be a Praise Service and follow the same order as last year's service in April, 2018, and starts at 9:30 a.m. The entire service (including hymns) will be printed in the bulletin for the day. Regular offerings will be given to the specified church and the loose offering will be divided four ways.



Each church should provide one usher, one communion server, one reader/lector, one cross bearer, and an acolyte to help take up offering and light the candles, and each church brings a cross. In addition, helpers will be needed beforehand to set up communion. MLLC and Waldeck are asked to bring a candle lighter, offering plates, communion wafers and grape juice.

After worship, Matt Kindsvatter will give a Temple Talk about Lutherhill's capital campaign building projects. There are envelopes available in our narthex for the project, which may either be taken to the service that day or mailed. There will also be a Children's Learning Activity and refreshments following worship. Hope to see you there!

### TEN PRINCIPLES OF CHRISTIAN STEWARDSHIP FROM SECOND CORINTHIANS

Adapted by Pastor David Tinker from various sources



- 1. Stewardship means the gift of yourself: It is an attitude. The Macedonians gave to their poorer brethren. St. Paul says, "they gave themselves first to the Lord." (2 Corinthians 8:5) Nothing and no amount of money is pleasing to the Lord until we give ourselves to Him.
- 2. Stewardship is proportionate to income. St. Paul reminded the Corinthians that the Macedonians "they voluntarily gave according to their means." (2 Corinthians 8:3) Stewardship is not giving to

budgets or any other external goal designated to elicit contributions. God asks us to look at our income and give proportionately.

- 3. Stewardship is the proof of the genuineness of our love. The manner in which we "put our money where our mouth is" is tangible demonstration of what is really in our hearts. St. Paul pointed out to the Corinthians that their participation in the offering was the way they would prove that their love was "genuine" (2 Corinthians 8:8).
- 4. Stewardship is self-sacrificing and is based on the self-sacrifice of Christ. Though our Lord Jesus Christ shared the eternal glory of the Godhead with the Father, "yet for our sakes He became poor:" He gave all that up to make us "rich" toward God through His

cross and resurrection (2 Corinthians 8:9).

- 5. Stewardship takes people who are ready "Prepared" for stewardship. The Holy Spirit makes stewards out of people through their faith. Men and Women must be prepared for stewardship through the Word. "For if the readiness is there, it is acceptable according to what a man has.." (2 Corinthians 8:12).
- 6. Stewardship is a joint venture within the Body of Christ. Our common participation in financial stewardship is the business of the people of God. Stewardship involves me, my brothers and sisters in the body of Christ and Christ himself.

We share with one another our mutual commitment to God and Church. It is sharing within the Body of Christ, as St. Paul pointed out to the Corinthians (2 Corinthians 8:14).

7. Stewardship is honest and honorable among Christians and needs no "Gimmicks." Many people are extremely nervous when it comes to "talking about money, in the church. Stewardship is more than "money", but it is also "money. More often than not, there is a direct connection between a person's wallet and the heart. St. Paul reminded the Corinthians, "We aim at what is honorable not only in the Lord's sight but also in the sight of men." (2 Corinthians

- 8:21). We do not need all sorts of high pressure tactics and "gimmicks" to make Christian stewardship work. We do not need the Gospel as the motivation.
- 8. Stewardship requires commitment. Our god has given us his full commitment, and we are called to make high commitments to God and his Church. St. Paul talked to the Corinthians about their pledges, their commitment, or their "estimate of giving", when he talked to them about "this gift you have promised." (2 Corinthians 9:11).
- 9. Stewardship is a challenge of our faith in the promises of God. That is the answer to the motivation of Christian

stewardship. We look to the promises St. Paul held out: "God is able to provide you with every blessing in abundance." (2 Corinthians 9:8), and "God loves a cheerful giver. (2 Corinthians 9:7) "You will be enriched (2 Corinthians 8:11).

10. Stewardship is our way of acknowledging and showing our faith in the Gospel. Living Stewardship is a tangible way to show that we believe the promises that God has given us in Christ. "Under the test of this service, you will glorify God by your obedience in acknowledging the Gospel of Christ" (2 Corinthians 9:13). Stewardship is the acid test of where our faith and our hearts are.
