

A total of 84 boxes were wrapped and were delivered to the Port of Houston by Brick Peele on November 27.





PASTOR'S ARTICLE Thoughts on Loving Your Neighbor By Pastor David Tinker

Recently there is something which has been on my heart about how we love our neighbors. It is about how we interact with restaurant servers.



A month or so ago I heard a friend note something about how people treat servers at restaurants. She herself works at a restaurant in another community. She was joining with other servers in complaint or observation about how churchgoing folks often treat restaurant servers in the afterchurch lunch rush. It was noted that this crowd is the worst (compared to other groups during the week) in how they treat servers and in what they give for tips. This is not about fast food or other places where one orders from a counter.

Here are some examples of what they observe about the "after church crowd" on Sundays:

*treat the server as an underling, not worthy of simple respect and kindness.

*tip 10% or less or even no tip, no matter the quality of service.

*leave little tracts and booklets about God as a tip, but don't give the monetary tip for service.

*complain that the server is working on a Sunday, and is disrespecting God, but the same customer is still showing up expecting service on a Sunday. The list could go on with the various unkind actions, but I think you get the point. Of course, this is far from universal, nor do all "after church" diners do all or any of these things. For some reason this behavior is prevalent and unique enough to note by restaurant servers. Some do note that a number of "after church" diners are kind, gracious and generous.

You may or may not have treated a restaurant server in these ways. Even so, many of our Christian brothers and sisters either do not understand how our restaurant system works, or they simply don't care. Ignorance and apathy are not excuses for being unkind in any context. In response to God's love we can strive to be better about our neighbors who make their living as restaurant servers.

Here are some ideas to consider as we love and care for our neighbors who work in full service restaurants:

*if you don't like tipping at a restaurant, don't eat in restaurants which consider tipping to the be normal way of doing business. Remember, the servers generally get a much lower pay rate from the restaurant, and they rely upon the tips to make a living. It is not a bonus to tip the 15-20% on top of the bill. It is how they are paid in our culture.

*strive to show kindness and respect, just as you would want to be treated.

*look the server in the eye and speak to him or her in a friendly and non-dismissive manner. *take the opportunity to be a friend, or at least a good neighbor, no matter how well you know the server.

♦ OFFICIAL ACTS:

*Build friendly relationships with the servers at restaurants. Remember their names, ask for them when you return to the restaurant

*Give a better than average tip. 18-25% is a good starting point. Tip on the whole bill, not just the food. Beverages of any type are also part of the work and expenses.

*Strive to be as cooperative, patient and loving as possible with the servers, for Sunday lunch is often quite busy.

*If you don't believe anybody should work on Sundays, then eat a simple meal at home instead

I strive to do these things in any restaurant I visit at any time. How we treat our neighbor in any context matters immensely. In the end, show kindness, and love your neighbor just as Jesus taught us and showed us.
