
YOGA CLASSES:

PASTOR DAVID TINKER CELEBRATES HIS 25TH ANNIVERSARY OF ORDINATION



On Sunday, June 9, Pastor David Tinker celebrated the 25th Anniversary of his Ordination as a Lutheran Pastor. A reception was held after worship at both Waldeck and Martin Luther Lutheran Churches. He wore the stole which was presented to him on June 9, 1994, at his ordination.

About Pastor David Tinker's Ordination:

He was ordained at Trinity English Lutheran Church in Fort Wayne, Indiana, at the 1994 Synod Assembly. He was the first student in his class to receive a call to serve in a special congregation. He was ordained with a fellow, seminary classmate on June 9, 1994.

He was ordained by Bishop Ralph Kempski, of the Indiana-Kentucky synod. His ordination sponsor was Pastor Ric Barnes. The Sponsor is the person, typically a fellow pastor, who presents the candidate to the bishop, and then later places the stole over the shoulders of the candidate. Several of his seminary professors also participated in the service. (continued on next page)

A highlight was when these professors joined Bishop Kempski and Pastor Barnes in the biblical action of "laying on of hands" as the bishop prayed for the Holy spirit in the candidate's life and ministry.

The stole which he wore was the same stole used at his ordination. The wooden cross he wore at the services on June 8-9 was given him by the people of his first congregation following the ordination ceremony.





A MODEL FOR DAILY DEVOTION By Pastor David Tinker

In my sermon on June 23, I shared a model for daily devotion. This is based on and adapted from the teachings of Martin Luther regarding our daily life of prayer. Here is what I shared on that day.

A technique which is suggested for daily putting off the old self and putting on the clothing of Christ is a spiritual self-examination.

Start with making the sign of the cross and invoking God's name: "In the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit."

Then pray the Lord's Prayer

3) Then spend some time prayerfully reflecting on one or more of the Ten Commandments. Consider how God's command convicts your sinful actions. Ask for God's forgiveness, and then pray for God's strength to strive to live according to God's way.

4) Then consider Jesus' call to love God, to love your neighbor, and to love one another in the community of faith. Consider where you have strayed from these commands. Ask for

God's forgiveness, and pray for God's strength to strive to live God's way.

Keep a small bowl of water nearby in your place of devotion. Dip a couple fingers in this 5) bowl at the end of this exercise and make the sign of the cross on your forehead or across your chest in remembrance of your baptism.

6) Spend your day striving to live God's most excellent way. Return to this exercise daily to seek God's forgiveness and strength for your life.

Use this individual prayer guide to help you take your faith seriously. Why? Because God takes our faith seriously and wants us to grow in union with him. The daily struggle within us to put off sin and put on Christ assures us that we are taking Jesus seriously, and that our faith is alive in him. I pray that the Holy Spirit will help all of us to strive daily to take our faith seriously and to see the positive implications of our lives being united with Jesus Christ.


Create this colorful July 4th craft.

What you need:

- Decorated card stock square (5"x 5")
- Scissors
- Hole punch
- 2 one-inch circles of card stock
- Glue
- Pipe cleaner (3 inches)
- · Drinking straw

What you do:

- Fold the square corner to corner to form an X. Unfold.
- 2. To make spokes, cut the four creases until an inch from the center.
- 3. Punch a hole in the middle of the square, near the tips of each spoke, and in the middle of each circle.
- 4. Fold each spoke toward the center, lining up the holes. Glue in place.
- 5. Wrap one end of the pipe cleaner around the top of the straw. Thread a circle, the pinwheel, and the remaining circle onto the pipe cleaner.
- 6. Roll the pipe cleaner end into a ball. Then spin!
