


Items discussed were Advent Services, the Road to Wonder Campaign (Lutherhill), and the Four Church services in 2020 at Lutherhill:

REVISITING THE RESOURCES FOR DISCIPLESHIP By Pastor David Tinker

Core to our faith is revisiting various foundation stones of our life and growth as children of God. By the power of God the Holy spirit each of us is called and enlivened to be disciples of Jesus Christ. A centerpiece of this calling is noted at the end of Matthew's Gospel book. Our Lord Jesus gave us the Great Commission to his Disciples as he was about to ascend to the Father. We read this account in Matthew 28:18-20: "And Jesus came and said to them, 'All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you. And remember, I am with you always, to the end of the age."".

This passage is very rich, for it is God's Call or "Marching Orders" for his followers.

The part I want to highlight right now is the part about Discipleship. Jesus calls us to "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations." To make disciples we are called to be disciples. Too often we think of being a disciple as just being one of the original twelve followers of Jesus, but that is too limiting. A disciple is a person who is learning to follow Jesus, and who is striving to live out the life which God the Son calls us to live.

There are ways of investing in growth as a disciple which the Christian Church has discovered and taught throughout the centuries. These are very normal Christian ways of doing things. Yet when, in response to God's Grace and Love, we work on these principles of discipleship we grow to know God and his ways, and we grow to live more faithfully and joyfully as God's children.

These principles of Discipleship are often called "the Six Marks of Discipleship". Each of these are foundational ways of living in response to God's goodness in our lives. Each of these lead us to a closer relationship with God and a more faithful walk in the way of Jesus. In my time among you I have noted these in one way or another. Over the months ahead I will be sharing more about each of these.

So for now, here are the Six Marks of Discipleship: In response to God's Grace I will strive to...

- 1) Pray daily
- 2) Worship weekly
- 3) Read the Bible daily
- 4) Serve at and beyond Martin Luther Lutheran Church
- 5) Be in Relationship with others to encourage spiritual growth
- 6) Give of my time, talents and resources in a generous manner and to the glory of God.

I look forward to seeing you at worship in the weeks ahead as we all grow closer to God, closer to one another, and live faithfully as Jesus' disciples in the 21st Century.

All approved.

The M&M Building has two broken windows; quote from Mill Creek Glass pending. Several electric outlets reported dead in the fellowship hall. Eldon Mikeska checked circuit panels and concluded he would have to check wiring in crawl space to determine if pests chewed on wiring.

Cub Daycare (Fayetteville, Texas) owners visited MLLC on August 13, 2019, and expressed interest in various items.

Entec Pest Control (Brenham) has been secured for church facilities; spraying includes quarterly treatment of perimeter of parsonage and M&M Building,

Stewardship Committee had no meeting.

Dayschool Committee – The decision was made to revisit daycare without infants accepting 2-5-year-olds. Full-time might be a better option as there is not enough in part-time for the director/ teachers. The budget would need to be reworked, for the school year 2020-21. All was approved.


