The Men in Mission of MLLC had a fantastic year for their Seafarer's Boxes for Christmas Ministry. Thank you to all who donated items for this special project this year. These boxes for the Port of Houston Seafarers' Christmas were prepared on Monday, November 24, at MLLC.

With the various donations from church members, Thrivent Financial, and Home Depot, the Men in Mission of MLLC had enough items to fill 100 boxes. Last year they had

enough for 86 boxes. Through effort by over a dozen volunteers aging from teens to seniors, these boxes were packed, giftwrapped, and prepared for transport.

Later that week, Brick Peele took the items to the Seafarer Chaplain's office at the Port of Houston. Our boxes were soon included in a delivery to a ship to bring Christmas Cheer to those who are so far from home at this Christmas Time. The boxes were filled with practical and fun items

such as: pens, candy, scarves, playing cards, toiletries, etc.

About 10,000 boxes are donated each year to the Port of Houston Chaplain
Seafarer's Center. For several years the MLLC Men in Mission have joyfully gathered, filled, wrapped, and delivered these Christmas Boxes. The goal is to deliver over 100 boxes in 2020. Thank you for your partnership in this mission of kindness and love for our neighbors at the Port of Houston.

### PASTOR'S ARTICLE

**Speaking the Truth with Love** By Pastor David Tinker

Interpersonal life in our world today, including the Body of Christ in this world, has been increasingly negative, divisive, destructive, fearful, disrespectful, hateful, dismissive, inflammatory, and more. As time progresses, I feel that we have less and less care, connection and kindness in how we relate with each other. There are all sorts of causes for this to which we can point. It all relates back to how we spend less and less time together as a culture. We relate more through social media, news media, texting, and the like, and less through face to face conversation and listening. We are relating less through love, and more through impersonal distance.

The deeper issue is that of sin. Yes, sin. When we treat others harshly or dismiss them as less than they are as the beloved of God, we are sinning. We are tearing down life. We are degrading the created dignity of our fellow humans. Some may say, "That is the way of the world, so get over it." By God's mercy and grace we are not to be overcome by the ways of this sin-filled world. And, this is the victory that has overcome the world---our faith." That faith is the gift and work of God active in our lives. Just because some or many do wrong doesn't mean we should do the same. We need to wake up, for the creeping progression of sin is overcoming us, both in the church and in society.

To address this, first the law of God – from Luther's Small Catechism:

The Eighth Commandment You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor. What is this? We are to fear and love God, so that we do not tell lies about our neighbors, betray or slander them, or destroy their reputations. Instead we are to come to their defense, speak well of them, and interpret everything they do in the best possible light.

One of the things that I have seen way too much of recently is what Luther addresses in this explanation. We are failing to speak well of others and failing to interpret everything they do in the best possible light. Within and outside the church I hear people or hear reports of people assuming the worst about the words or actions of others. It is most concerning when it happens in the context of a local Christian congregation.

... whenever we have an opportunity, let us work for the good of all ...



Now we have some good news:

We give thanks that God has first loved us in Jesus Christ. In 1 John 4:19, John states, "We love because he (God) first loved us." The suffering, death, and resurrection of Jesus brings about the forgiveness of our sin. In response to the foundational action of God, Jesus teaches us that we are to love one another. Here is what St. Paul notes about we are called to

love one another. In Galatians 6:10, Paul writes, "So then, whenever we have an opportunity, let us work for the good of all, and especially for those of the family of faith."

We are invited to the following things:

- To look back at our 1) recent actions, attitudes, words, and responses to situations. How have we disparaged others? How have we not given a person the benefit of the doubt? How have we failed to look deeper into a situation to make sure what we have heard is really true? How have we played into the disease of gossip? How have you assumed the worst about someone's role in life, statements, actions, and even one's faith?
- 2) To confess your sin to god. This can be during our general confession at worship. This could be in a conversation with a pastor or a Christian friend. This could be in a time of quiet prayer with the Lord. As you confess, be assured of God's powerful forgiveness of your sin.
- 3) To prayerfully ponder the teachings of Scripture, Creed, and Lutheran Confessional documents (such as Luther's Large and Small Catechisms). The statement above is from the Small Catechism.

Look at how you can strive to live according to these long-held teachings of Christianity.

- 4) To strive to bring reconciliation between you and those who have been mistreated by your thoughts, words, or deeds.
- 5) To recognize the influence of the sinful world as it possibly has brought you down to its harmful level. With

this recognition of truth in your life, find ways to push back against that influence. Look at your use of social media. Pay attention to how you watch and respond to news stories. Work on seeing how much you have participated in gossip or disrespectful words about others.

In all these, with God's help, we get to strive to put away such actions and attitudes. We need to be pushing back against the things which bring us down. We need to resist

things which draw us away from respect, kindness, building up others, praying for one another, listening to God and his Word, and speaking about others with the best intentions. With God's abundant help we can have healing of relationships between us and the Lord, and between each other. With God's help we can bridge the distance between one another, which will lead to more lovingly honest relationships and connections. With God's help we can speak the truth with love.
