

Our Situation in July 2020

In observing the situation with the COVID 19 pandemic, the Church Council has decided to continue to phase in the "inperson" worship and activities. Here are notes from the council and worship committee

Here is the Plan for the month of July:

*We will gather for worship at our usual times: Saturday at 6 p.m.; Sunday at 10 a.m. The Sunday service will continue to be shared as a Facebook Live video:

https://www.facebook.com/mll ccarmine/

- *There is no pressure to attend the in-person services. This is a time of transition. Use your best judgment for your situation.
- *Masks covering nose and mouth are encouraged, but not mandatory.
- *Saturday service should be reserved, as much as possible,



for our senior, adult worship attendees.

*Sunday service should be reserved, as much as possible, for the younger than senior individuals.

*In consideration of state guidance, the limit in our sanctuary for worship services will be 50% or about 100. Every other row will be blocked off. Observe social distancing.



*In July, we will begin offering Holy Communion by individual, prepackaged kits – bread and grape juice (fruit of the vine) in each kit. Those participating in the Sacrament will pick up their individual kit as they enter the sanctuary. Instructions will be given at

worship. Fill out communion cards upon entering sanctuary.

*Group meetings and class meetings will phase in at various times in the summer.
*The church office staff will only be on site as needed, but generally Monday-Friday. For emergencies, please contact Pastor David Tinker on his cell phone: 713-461-8007

The minutes and treasurer's report from the May Council meeting were approved.

Pastor's Report

An item of special note regarding CashApp and Venmo – Both of these organizations have been contacted regarding setting up an account with MLLC, and we are waiting on replies from both.




(Brick Peele visited Israel about two years ago.) These pictures were taken from the top of the Mount of the Beatitudes, where Jesus taught the crowds. The nearest towns are Tabgha, Capernaum and Tiberius, which is on the northwest shore of the Sea of Galilee.

Capernaum is considered the Town of Jesus (spoken of in Matthew 4:13). The Disciple Peter lived there and in his house, Jesus healed Peter's mother-in-law (recorded in Matthew 8:14-15).

The Mount of the Beatitudes is where Jesus gave the Sermon on the Mount (pictured on the top left). (Read about it in the Book of Matthew, chapters 5-7).

The picture at right (taken from The Church of the Beatitudes) shows the Sea of Galilee in the background. Most of Jesus' ministry took place around the Sea of Galilee.

The picture at middle-left is of the altar inside The Church of the Beatitudes (Roman Catholic). Picture at the bottom is from the Sea of Galilee showing a boat that dates 2,000 years ago and was found when the Sea of Galilee was 15 feet below normal a few years ago.
