

*In consideration of state guidance, the limit in our sanctuary for worship services will be 50% or about 100 persons. Every other row will be blocked off. Observe social distancing. We are offering Holy Communion by individual, prepackaged kits - bread and grape juice (fruit of the vine) in each kit. Those participating in the Sacrament will pick up their individual kit as they enter the sanctuary. Instructions will be given at worship. Fill out your communion card upon entering the sanctuary and place it in the offering plate. *Group meetings and class meetings will phase in at various times in the summer and autumn. It is important to

consider the health of others


