Summer 2021 COVID19 Pandemic Reopening By Pastor David Tinker

We have been open for in-person worship since June 2020. For the past year we have observed extra precautions for our in-person services. Conditions related to the COVID19 pandemic continue to improve in Texas and Fayette County. We are thankful for many fewer ill people and fewer deaths due to the illness. We are thankful for the vaccines and the work of everybody to improve conditions for everybody.

In consultation with the MLLC Church council, the Worship Committee has prepared a plan for moving toward more normal worship practices in our context. Throughout the summer months, starting in June, we will make these various transitions. These transitions will not happen all at once. Only some will be starting on June 6.

Here are the main points:

- *More ushers will be needed. Please plan on serving when your team is scheduled. In the past year we only needed about 2 per service, but we will need the full teams starting on June 6. *We will resume using the more typical liturgy songs. These include the Hymn of Praise, Gospel Acclamation, etc.
- *Using more songs and hymns in worship.
- *Resume offering communion with bread and wine. We will offer the Sacrament by continuous service. Individual cups will be social distanced within the trays. Bread will be served with tongs rather than by hand. We will also continue to make available the individual kits (such as we have used in the past several months) for those who prefer this form of reception.
- *We will refrain from the 1st Sunday style, "table groups," until a yet to be determined date. Communion will continue to be served at all Saturday and Sunday services.
- *We will continue to recommend social distancing and other safer practices in the worship space.
- *At some point, assuming conditions continue to improve, we will resume passing the offering plates. As we are resuming other songs and such, we will resume the presentation of the offerings as part of the service. This will happen even before we resume the passing of the plates.
- *Sharing of the peace will continue. Please respect the comfort level of your fellow worshippers. Not all will wish to have physical contact/handshakes with others, due to personal COVID precautions. Please do not be rude or offended if another person refrains from shaking hands.

Our goal is a blend of mutual care and a desire to return to normalcy. If conditions deteriorate notably in the summer, we will need to alter this plan. The Worship Committee and church council will keep watch of public health recommendations, and alter this plan as needed. You are encouraged to do what is best for your situation.



Luther's Letter
