


Worship on Labor Day Weekend – September 5 - Food Changes By Pastor David Tinker

#### LABORING FOR THE LORD

For many people, the pandemic redefined work, with more employees logging hours from a home office — or kitchen table. Boundaries between job and personal life blurred, as did any sense of being "off duty." Most of us prefer clear divisions between our tasks and time. While such separations may help with scheduling, they are artificial human constructs. "Whatever your task," says Colossians 3:23 (NRSV, emphasis added) — whether in public or private, family or job, spiritual or worldly activities — "put yourselves into it as done for the Lord." Verse 17 tells us to "do everything" in Jesus' name, "giving thanks to God the Father through him." That means even work and worship interlock. As Rick Warren writes, "Work becomes worship when you dedicate it to God and perform it with an awareness of his presence."

#### Confirmation Class Update - Fall 2021

The Fall Semester of Confirmation Class begins in September. Here are the scheduled dates for the Fall Semester: September 8, 15,22, October 6, 13, 20

Classes will be held at Martin Luther Lutheran Church in Carmine on Wednesdays, 4:15 – 6:15 p.m. Students gather in the Mission & Ministry Building. This is the newer, tan building, located across the street from the main church building in Carmine. The building address is 250 Augsburg Ave, Carmine, TX.

Students are asked to bring a Bible to class. The teachers prefer that the translation of the Bible used is the NRSV – New Revised Standard Version. Students who have previously participated in First Holy Communion Class at MLLC should already have a copy of this Bible. Youth who have lost their standard Student Bible may purchase a new one by contacting Pastor David Tinker. The cost is \$20. Cash or check (made payable to: MLLC). Students who did not previously receive a copy of this Bible can get one from the pastor at class time. Other materials will be issued to the students when we gather for class.

This class is for baptized youth in grades 7 and 8, or high school youth who have not yet affirmed their baptism. Unbaptized youth and their parent are invited to talk with the pastor about being baptized. The program runs for two school years. The lessons alternate in a two-year cycle of a Bible Year and a Small Catechism Year. The 2021-2022 school year will be the Bible year. The goal of the class is to provide age level instruction in core parts of the Christian faith as youth prepare for adult involvement in their faith and the church.

#### <u> Animal Blessing Sunday – October 3 at Waldeck</u>

You and your animals are invited to worship at our partner church in Waldeck on a special date. Worship will be at their normal time, 8:00 a.m. The goal is to hold the service outside in the covered pavilion. You are encouraged to bring your pet, animal, plush friend, etc. for the special prayers of blessing.

For many years our they have offered this special service each October. It is held each year on a Sunday near October 4. Why that date? Because October 4 is the day Christians remember the ministry of St. Francis of Assisi. St. Francis had a special ministry of care for animals of God's creation. To honor this ministry many churches have set aside time each October to offer a special prayer of blessing for pets, livestock, and their human families and farmers.

In recent years there have been birds, goats, and even plush friends. Since not all families are in a situation to provide for a live pet, the Animal Blessing in Waldeck also includes plush friends.

Whether or not you bring an animal for the blessing, you are invited to bring a donation of pet food items and monetary gifts for the Animal Shelter in La Grange. In the past they have noted a special need for puppy and kitten food for the younger animals in the shelter.

We look forward to seeing you, and maybe even a special animal in your life, on October 3 at 8:00 a.m. Worship will be held at MLLC at our normal times of Saturday at 6 p.m. and Sunday at 10 a.m., but animal blessing service will only be at Waldeck.
