Together in the Holy Spirit By Pastor David Tinker

People tell me all the time that we are intensely divided in our life today. So much of life has been split by people pushing or migrating to the extremes, rather than drawing together. This has been expressed in our nearly all areas of life. Our nation, culture, churches, and families have been filled with contentious division and misery. We have devalued one another and dismissed one another. We have witnessed the spread of half-truths, intentional misrepresentations, and lies. We have seen an intensification of political and social division. We have seen an increase of verbal and physical violence and intimidation.

Much of the sin which causes trouble in this world is the rejection of the Holy Spirit's work in our lives. We often mistreat and harm one another. Our sinful attitudes and actions more often serve to divide and harm rather than reconcile and unite. Sometimes our interpersonal climate works against those most close to us in our lives, such as family, friends, and fellow Christians. In 2 Corinthians 12:20, Paul writes of the sin which harms our interpersonal connections. He writes, "For I fear that when I come, I may find you not as I wish, and that you may find me not as you wish; I fear that there may perhaps be quarreling, jealousy, anger, selfishness, slander, gossip, conceit, and disorder."

St. Paul deals with this issue more fully in chapter 5 of Galatians. This is in the familiar section about the Fruit of the Spirit. Verses 19-21b show us the sinful fruit of our lives, "19Now the works of the flesh are obvious: fornication, impurity, licentiousness, 20 idolatry, sorcery, enmities, strife, jealousy, anger, quarrels, dissensions, factions, 21 envy, drunkenness, carousing, and things like these." These can be divided into sections about four main topics: love and sexuality, spiritual, interpersonal, and over consumption.

The Fruit of the Spirit counter these sinful actions in the same order:

Love and Sexuality: love Spiritual: joy, peace

Interpersonal: peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, gentleness

Over Consumption: self-control

As you see, most of the works of the flesh and the fruit of the Spirit are related to how we treat one another. The central point in both passages is to receive the goodness of the Lord which leads us out of sin and into the new way of Jesus. Foundational to this is the Holy Spirit in our lives. The Holy Spirit is God drawing us into a faith relationship with our Lord Jesus Christ. The Holy Spirit of God is who continues to enliven, empower, and inspire us to produce the fruit which builds up our lives. This, in turn, builds up our community of faith connections. It is a gift from God which helps us to make the world a better place for all whom we encounter.

When we face the angst, extremism, and division of our current day, we are reminded that Jesus has died for the forgiveness of these things. He has brought with him to the cross the fleshly passions and desires which stir us to respond to this world with increased hatred, depersonalization, and division against others. With the power of the Holy Spirit, we need to be recentered in Jesus. The Holy Spirit and the teachings of Jesus turn our lives toward peace and reconciliation. Initially it is a harder way, but it is the most excellent way of Jesus.

BISHOP'S FORUM REGARDING ELCA QUESTIONS.

On Monday, July 10, at 6 p.m., our synod bishop, Michael Rinehart, will be present at MLLC to answer questions about the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA), our denominational organization. These questions have been formulated by our church council. There will be a time for additional questions from the congregation at the end of the forum.

On August 27, after the Sunday 10 a.m. worship service, there will be a specially called congregational meeting to vote on whether or not the congregation wishes to continue the process of looking into alternative Lutheran church denominational organizations for possible transfer of MLLC into.

Please note: this would not be a vote to leave the ELCA. When and if such a vote were to happen, that would be a very different process. If you have any questions about this, please contact Council President Tim Sanders or Pastor David Tinker.


