

### Our Response to God in Worship By Pastor David Tinker

A regular part of our worship services in our Lutheran tradition is the giving of offerings. These are most often given as monetary gifts of cash and checks. The offering is gathered and presented most typically in the latter half of the service, generally after the intercessory prayer and before Holy Communion.

There is an important reason for why we give our offerings during worship. It is about giving thanks to God. An important verse which points to this is from 2 Corinthians 9:15, "Thanks be to God for his indescribable gift!" Paul notes this in the context of his teachings about making generous offerings.

There are two core themes to our worship services every week. These are repentance and thanksgiving. Repentance is turning from sin to live for God. This includes receiving the mercy of God, returning to our relationship with the Lord, confessing our sin to God, and then getting back track with following his ways. Thanksgiving is our holy response for all God has done for us in Jesus. There are three common expressions of thanksgiving in worship. These are: songs and words of praise, our offerings, and the Holy Communion. Together these help us refocus our lives and priorities on what God has first done for us. These are ways to give of ourselves fully in praise and thanksgiving to the Lord.

Some have suggested in the church at large that we should just send a bill yearly, quarterly, or monthly, etc. This bill would be some standard amount needed to cover the expected expenses of the church. Technically, this would work. On the other hand, it would very much miss the core value of how and why we give the offerings – this is to openly give thanks to God as the people gathered in worship.

So, when you give your offerings at worship, remember to dedicate these with a quiet prayer of thanksgiving. It could be something as simple as, "Thank you, Lord," as you place your offering and communion record card in the offering plate.

Many are sending in their offerings by mail or using the online giving. Some have lost income and are having significant trouble making ends meet. Some weeks they may have little or nothing of funds to put in the place. Some give an offering once a month for the whole month. For whatever reason a person does not have an offering envelope, check, or cash to put in the plate on any given Saturday or Sunday, there is a way to offer thanks to God at the offering time. I encourage those in such situations to place their communion record card in the offering plate while offering a quite prayer of, "Thank you, Lord," as well.

In all things as we gather at worship, have in mind that this is always an opportunity for two actions: 1) repentance, and 2) thanksgiving. Some weeks will be more of one than the other, and that is fine. What matters most is that you are gathering with fellow Christians at your church to be with Jesus and each other. Through these means we get to express both repentance and thanksgiving.






Church Fellowship Meal - after Worship/about 11:15 a.m.
