A New Year as Disciples of Jesus By Pastor David Tinker

We are beginning a new year. Part of anything new is the opportunity to revisit what is truly important in our lives. By God's grace and the guidance of the Holy Spirit, as followers of Jesus Christ we are invited to strive to grow in our discipleship. We are invited to invest in our faith life in ways which connect us with God and with one another.

All Christians are called to be disciples of Jesus Christ. This is not just something which 12 men did nearly 2000 years ago. Disciples are Christians who are learning to follow Jesus and the regular ways of the Christian faith. There are six common Christian practices which help us grow in faith and build up our ministry to others. I have noted these in some way previously, but it is good for us to revisit these in this New Year. These are referred to as "The Six Marks of Discipleship".

In response to God's Grace I will strive to...

- 1) Pray daily
- 2) Worship weekly
- 3) Read the Bible daily

These first three especially help us hear the Good News and be connected with God's grace. The second three are more about how we live daily life in response to the great things God has done for us through the ministry of Jesus Christ. These are:

4) Serve at and beyond Martin Luther Lutheran Church

5) Be in Relationship with others to encourage spiritual growth

6) Give of my time, talents, and resources in a generous manner and to the glory of God.

We may do some of these well, while struggling with others. That is normal. We are invited to invest in our faith. With this New Year you are invited to start with one of these that is not going as well for you. Then work on others as time goes by. Let's look at each of these briefly.

1) Pray Daily

We are called in 1 Thessalonians 5:16-18 to "Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks in all circumstances..." Prayer is our opportunity to connect with God and to seek the benefit of others throughout our days. If you are not praying daily, then plan a time each day to offer some form of prayer. It could be at morning, mealtime, bedtime, or some other time. It may just start with offering the Lord's Prayer. It may be a listing of things for which you are thankful. What matters is that you pray.

2) Worship Weekly

Worshipping with the community of faith on a weekly basis has been a centerpiece of Christian life since the beginning. This gives us the opportunity for hearing God's Word, receiving Holy Communion, connecting with one another, and being sent forth in service for the week. Even in the early church Christians struggled with this discipline of the faith. In Hebrews 10:24-25, we read, "24 And let us consider how to provoke one another to love and good deeds, 25 not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day approaching." So, with this we encourage you to schedule worship participation into your life. Each week our Shared Ministry offers worship at these times:

Sundays 10:00 a.m. at Carmine, Saturdays at 6:00 p.m. at Carmine, and 8:00 a.m. Sundays at Waldeck. If these times truly don't work due to work, health, etc., contact me to see how we can be creative about connecting with God and each other at worship.

3) Read the Bible Daily

St. Paul teaches us in Colossians 3:16a: "Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly…" We are invited to keep connected with God's Word throughout our days. Some people read a passage or chapter of a book each day. Some use a daily devotional book, devotional phone app, or email service, etc. to provide scripture readings and reflections. Some use a guide for extensive daily reading. What matters is that you are getting into God's Holy Word each day.

4) Serve at and beyond Martin Luther Lutheran Church

Our service to God always includes serving within the congregational context, but it is not limited to what we do together at the church building. As we express our love for God and love for neighbor, we will always find this includes our ministry in daily life. We get to serve others in ways that just won't happen at the church building, and this is good. When we serve others in work, school, home, family, neighborhood and beyond, we are doing God's will. We get to be a neighbor in how we serve. As we serve our neighbors in need, it is part of how we show our love for God.

5) Be in Relationship with others to encourage spiritual growth

This includes our connections with fellow Christians and our connections with people who don't yet know Jesus. As we serve, learn, and enjoy fellowship together we get to build one another up in Christ. As we seek to be a blessing to others through word and deed, we get to help others know Jesus better. What matters is that we love, serve, and encourage others as true friends. Our faith is passed on to others, one person at a time. When we live out God's love with those we know we will encourage a connection for others with Jesus as well.

6) Give of my time, talents, and resources in a generous manner and to the glory of God.

This is often a struggle for many because it involves generous relinquishing of material possessions, along with time and abilities. When we give it away, we don't control it anymore, but that is where spiritual growth can happen. When we realize that God is God and we are not, we begin to see our lives transformed. Also, Jesus tells us in Luke 12:34, "For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also." If we treasure our relationship with God and our connection with the ministries of his Church, then generous giving of weekly offerings will help us connect with that eternal treasure. Those who strive to give a tithe (10% or more of one's income to God) find it is a good source of joy and spiritual growth.

So, as you enter into 2024, I invite you to find one or more of these areas which is not your strongest. Then, inspired by God's loving Grace, work toward growth on one of these Six Marks of Discipleship. Let me know how you are doing with this as the year continues.

*Our goal is to collect at least \$500 for our local food pantry.




