More Than a Negative Adapted from LC-MS Stewardship By Pastor David Tinker

Even if you've never had to testify in court, a thousand TV shows have made you familiar with the question, "Do you swear to tell the truth, the whole truth and nothing but the truth?" Why not just make people swear to tell the truth? Or make them promise not to lie?

Any parent who has ever had to interrogate a child about a broken cookie jar or a scuffle over a toy knows the answer. There are plenty of ways to try to get out of trouble without technically lying. You tell just enough of the truth to skate on by.

We often play the game of seeing how close we can get to sinning without technically going over the line.

But in our heart of hearts we know that this is not what God intended when he gave us the commandments. As we see in Luther's Small Catechism, God is not giving us a merely negative rule and challenging us to just barely stay away from this or that. There is much more to each commandment than a prohibition. For example, we shouldn't just avoid murdering people — we should be of service to our neighbor.

For each negative prohibition in the commandments there is a positive good that we are to cherish and protect. In Luther's explaination of the Eighth Commandment, that gift is the reputation of our neighbor and our relationship with him:

The Eighth Commandment

You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor.

What is this?

We are to fear and love God, so that we do not tell lies about our neighbors, betray or slander them, or destroy their reputations. Instead we are to come to their defense, speak well of them, and interpret everything they do in the best possible light.

Your relationship with your family members (who are your nearest neighbors), the other members of your congregation, your coworkers, and your friends is one of the most precious gifts for our loving God. You need to exercise good stewardship with this gift just as much as you need to exercise good stewardship with your life, resources, time, and income. This is an especially fragile gift because it's easy to ruin a relationship with slander and talking behind someone's back.

Remember, speaking well of your neighbor in Christian love is absolutely free; it costs you nothing, yet it pays you great dividends. If you find this challenging at times, if you are tempted to speak ill of others, just remember that this other person is also a beloved one for whom your Lord Jesus suffered and died. Your Lord Jesus loves you both.

ELCA Update

Following a vote of the MLLC Council on April 9, and a meeting with Bishop Rinehart on April 16, the following two meetings have been scheduled. These are based on standard ELCA congregation constitutional procedures.

*As a member church of the ELCA we must follow the most up to date specifications of the Model Constitution for Congregations, even though our congregational constitution has not been properly updated to the current required provisions. Consultation with Bishop Michael Rinehart

Monday, June 3, 6 p.m.

All members of MLLC are invited to this meeting with our bishop. It is an opportunity to share, listen, ask questions, and to seek guidance. This is different from the open forums with our bishop and the representatives of the various other Lutheran denominational organizations. This is a fulfillment of the model constitution, Section C6.05.a which reads:

a. A resolution indicating the intent to terminate its relationship must be adopted at two legally called and conducted special meetings of this congregation by a two-thirds vote of the voting members present at each meeting. The first such meeting may be held no sooner than 30 days after written notice of the meeting is received by the bishop of the synod, during which time this congregation shall consult with the bishop and the bishop's designees, if any. The times and manner of the consultation shall be determined by the bishop in consultation with the Congregation Council. Unless the bishop and/or the bishop's designees are voting members of this congregation, they shall have voice but not vote at the first meeting.

Vote on Possible Termination of our Relationship with the ELCA

Sunday, June 23, after the 10 a.m. worship service.

This is a vote on whether or not the congregation wants to continue our membership in the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA). This is the first of potentially two votes on this issue.

*If the vote on June 23 shows at least 66.7% (2/3) of the qualified voters present voting to terminate our relationship with the ELCA, then there could be a second vote. Per the constitution (Section C6.05 c), which reads: *c. If the resolution was adopted by a two-thirds vote of the voting members present at the first meeting, the bishop of the synod and this congregation shall continue in consultation, as specified in paragraph a. above, during a period of at least 90 days after receipt by the bishop of the attestation and certification as specified in paragraph b. above.*

This potential second vote would be after a 90-day waiting/consultation period which would include an additional consultation meeting with our bishop. If, after the consultation with our bishop, there is a desire to hold the final vote to terminate our relationship with the ELCA, then a 2nd vote will be held at a yet to be determined date. This vote also must also achieve at least a 66.7% (2/3) vote affirming the choice to terminate our relationship with the ELCA. This second vote, if held, would also include the congregation's choice of which Lutheran church organization we would have for a new affiliation. If the 2nd vote passes, then the congregation is immediately no longer a congregation of the ELCA, and it has then joined the new group. That is why the new affiliation is included in the vote. If the 2nd vote is scheduled, then the congregational leaders must initiate appropriate connections with the other Lutheran organization of choice in preparation for a potential transfer. The ones we have met with for consideration of affiliation are:

Lutheran Churches in Mission for Christ (LCMC)

North American Lutheran Church (NALC),

and Lutheran Church – Missouri Synod (LC-MS).

As of this writing, no choice has been made by the congregational leadership. If the 2nd vote does not pass with at least 66.7% (2/3), then the resolution is ended. We continue ministry as a congregation of the ELCA.

*If the 1st vote does not show a 66.7% (2/3) of those voting affirming the choice of terminating our relationship with the ELCA, the resolution does not pass, and thus, no second vote. We continue ministry as a congregation of the ELCA.

*If the congregation passes both votes as required by the constitution, including the choice to join another Lutheran Church organization, such as LCMC, NALC, LC-MS, then all church property continues with the congregation as it affiliates with the new Lutheran Church organization. If either vote does not pass, then the property stays with the congregation as it continues ministry in the ELCA. Note: not having a church affiliation with another Lutheran Church organization at the time of the vote could lead to notable complications regarding the ownership of church property.

*Qualified Voters is specifically noted in the constitution. The church council will follow constitutional rules regarding who is allowed to vote at a congregational meeting. We look to C8.02.c: Voting members are confirmed members. Such confirmed members, during the current or preceding calendar year, shall have communed in this congregation and shall have made a contribution of record to this congregation. Members of this congregation who have satisfied these basic standards shall have the privilege of voice and vote at every regular and special meeting of this congregation as well as the other rights and privileges ascribed to voting members by the provisions of this constitution and its bylaws. They shall not have voted as a seasonal member of another congregation of this church in the previous two calendar months.

This means that for congregational meetings qualified voters are those confirmed members of MLLC who have participated in Holy Communion at MLLC and have made a financial contribution to MLLC (as shown on congregational records for both communion and financial giving) in the current year (example - 2024) or the previous year (example - 2023). Based on how we record communion and contributions in the church office each week on Monday, these acts of participation would need to be completed at least a week prior to any congregational meeting. For the vote on June 23, we will have a list of qualified voters at the meeting. Only qualified voters will receive a ballot. Just showing up on the day without a contribution and a communion in the stated period will not qualify a voter. To show your participation in communion, remember to complete and turn in a communion card to an usher or the offering plate. To show your participation in financial giving, make sure you use an offering envelope with your name on it. Both the communion cards and offering envelopes are available in the pew racks at every worship service.

Younger youth

It is the tradition of our Crossroads Shared Ministry Churches – Carmine, Waldeck, Round Top, and Shelby – to encourage the younger youth (ending grade 6 and younger) to attend Lutherhill together. This has traditionally been the final week of camp. In 2024, that week is Week 8 – July 28 – August 2. If this week doesn't work for your family, see the Lutherhill web site for more dates. Additionally, MLLC has set aside budget money to cover up to 100% of camp expenses for youth who attend a week at Lutherhill. This will come from donations to the camping fund and other giving. Some of this will also come from the aluminum can fund of Lutheran Men in Mission. That will be at least \$50 of the total available for each youth. Items needed in Fabric Kits for LWR: Two pieces of cotton or cotton-blend fabric (no knits or 100% polyester) Fabric should have no stains or holes and be cut into pieces measuring: 2 1/4 years of 60" wide fabric, or 3 yards of 44" wide fabric, or 4 yards of 36" wide fabric Two spools of neutral-colored, general-purpose thread, 250-300 yards each.

Fold thread and one piece of fabric inside second piece and tie with yarn, sturdy string, ribbon or strip of fabric.

SAVE CANCELLED POSTAGE STAMPS for MLLC WELCA

A new resource, **Stamps for the Wounded**, has been found to donate our cancelled postage stamps. Previously, we gave them to Lutheran World Relief, but they no longer have this program.

Stamps for the Wounded serves our wounded and ill servicemen and women who are inand out-patients at Department of Veterans Affairs hospitals and domiciliaries located across the country. These people have served in the U.S. Military in foreign wars as far back as WWII extending to the most recent actions in the Middle East and in trouble spots all over the world.

These stamps can give bedridden patients, long-term treatment patients, and convalescent patients, a consuming interest. They can sort and mount stamps while in bed. If ambulatory, or even in a wheelchair, they can pass happy hours soaking stamps and mounting them in albums. Even the withdrawn, mentally disabled patient takes pleasure in using more common stamps in organized therapy sessions to make fanciful greeting cards, or to cover decorative boxes.

Please bring your cut out stamps with a ¹/₄ inch edge or your envelopes with stamps to the parlor.


Newsletters by Email

Two pieces of cotton or cotton-blend fabric (no knits or 100% polyester)

Fabric should have no stains or holes and be cut into pieces measuring:

2 1/4 years of 60" wide fabric, or

3 yards of 44" wide fabric, or

4 yards of 36" wide fabric

Two spools of neutral-colored, general-purpose thread, 250-300 yards each.

Fold thread and one piece of fabric inside second piece and tie with yarn, sturdy string, ribbon or strip of fabric.
